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## Amendment (with title amendment)

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Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. The Arcade and Amusement Center Study

Commission is created. For the purpose of this section, the term

"commission" means the Arcade and Amusement Study Commission.

The purpose of the Commission is to address amusement game

standards, definitions, and regulations governing the offer of

amusement game play at retail venues throughout the state.

Section 2. The Commission shall consist of five members,

(1) The secretary of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, or their designee.

appointed by the Governor, and shall consist of the following

members:

- (2) The Executive Director of the Department of Revenue, or their designee.
- (3) Two members of the amusement game arcade industry in the state.
  - (4) One member representing the consumer.
- Section 3. The Arcade and Amusement Study Commission is assigned to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation for administrative purposes only. The commission shall by staffed by the department.
- Section 4. <u>Members of the commission shall be appointed by</u>
  <u>the Governor, and shall organize following appointment to select</u>
  <u>a chair and set meetings.</u>
- Section 5. A vacancy of an appointed member of the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. A vacancy of any member who may select a designee shall be filled by the member's selected designee or, if the vacancy concerns a member's selected designee, shall be filled by the member or another designee selected by the member.

  Vacancies must be filled within 30 days.
- Section 6. The commission shall hold all meetings within the state. Meetings of the commission shall be open to the public.
- Section 7. Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but are entitled to receive reimbursement for travel and per diem expenses as provided by section 112.061, Florida Statutes, while carrying out official business of the commission.

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Section 8. The commission shall report its findings and recommendations in an official report adopted by the members to be transmitted to the Governor, President of the Senate, and Speaker of the House of Representative by February 1, 2005. The commission shall automatically expire upon submission of its report to the Governor and the Legislature.

Section 9. This act shall take effect October 1, 2004.

An act relating to arcade amusement centers; providing legislative findings; creating the Arcade and Amusement Center Study Commission; specifying the purpose of the commission; providing for appointment and qualification of members; providing for staffing of the commission; providing for filling of vacancy; requiring that meetings of the commission be open to the public and held within the state; authorizing reimbursement for travel and per diem expenses for members while carrying out official business of the commission; requiring the commission to report its findings to the Governor and to legislative leaders; providing for the expiration of the commission; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, The arcade and amusement industry is an expanding segment of the economy, with potential for significant impacts on Florida's tourist industry; and
