Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 Section 1. Subsections (6), (7), (8), and (9) of section 509.221, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as subsections (7), (8), (9), and (10), respectively, a new subsection (6) is added to that section, and subsection (1) and redesignated subsection (10) of that section are amended, to read:

509.221 Sanitary regulations.--

(1) Each public lodging establishment and each public food service establishment shall be supplied with potable water and shall provide adequate sanitary facilities for the accommodation of its employees and guests. Such facilities may include, but are not limited to, showers, handwash basins, diaper-changing tables, toilets, and bidets. Such sanitary facilities shall be connected to approved plumbing. Such plumbing shall be sized, installed, and maintained in accordance with the Florida Building Code. Wastewater or

sewage shall be properly treated onsite or discharged into an approved sewage collection and treatment system.

- (6)(a) Each public food service establishment licensed on or after January 1, 2005, and each public food service establishment issued a renewal license on or after that date shall provide a diaper-changing table in a properly designated public bathroom, except that:
- 1. A mobile food dispensing vehicle, theme park food cart, vending machine, or public food service establishment or a food vendor participating in a temporary food service event need not provide a public bathroom.
- 2. An arcade, a mall, or a flea market that contains a public food service establishment that does not offer seating within the public food service establishment may provide centrally located bathroom facilities that are accessible to patrons of the establishments in the arcade, mall, or flea market, which bathroom facilities must be within 300 feet of each establishment and must be equipped with a diaper-changing table.
- 3. A public food service establishment that is located within a theme park or an entertainment complex may provide centrally located bathroom facilities that are accessible to patrons of the establishments in the theme park or entertainment complex, which bathroom facilities must be within 300 feet of each establishment and must be equipped with a diaper-changing table.
- 4. A public food service establishment that seats 10 persons or fewer shall provide a minimum of one bathroom that is accessible to the public and is equipped with a diaper-changing table.

A public food service establishment that is located within a public lodging establishment may provide public 2 3 bathrooms located within the public lodging establishment if such bathrooms are available for use by the patrons of the 4 5 public food service establishment during all hours of 6 operation, are within 300 feet of the public food service 7 establishment, are equipped with a diaper-changing table, and 8 are located on the same floor as the public food service 9 establishment. 10 (b) As used in this subsection, the term 11 'diaper-changing table" means a sturdy table or an elevated surface that has a changing surface that is at least 36 inches 12 above floor level and is not used for any purpose other than 13 diaper changing. In addition, the diaper-changing table must 14 be adjacent to or near the bathroom sink, must have a clean, 15 moisture-proof surface, must be sturdy and maintained in good 16 17 repair, and must be kept free of all objects except those used for diaper changing. 18 19 (C) The division must establish by rule procedures for inspecting diaper-changing tables and procedures for 20 21 disinfecting diaper-changing tables and disposing of soiled 22 diapers. (10) Subsections (2), (5), and (7) (6) do not apply 23 24 to any facility or unit classified as a resort condominium, 25 nontransient apartment, or resort dwelling as described in s. 509.242(1)(c), (d), and (g). 26 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. 28
