Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsections (6), (7), (8), and (9) of section 509.221, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as subsections (7), (8), (9), and (10), respectively, a new subsection (6) is added to that section, and subsection (1) and redesignated subsection (10) of that section are amended, to read:

509.221 Sanitary regulations. --

(1) Each public lodging establishment and each public food service establishment shall be supplied with potable water and shall provide adequate sanitary facilities for the accommodation of its employees and guests. Such facilities may include, but are not limited to, showers, handwash basins, diaper-changing tables, toilets, and bidets. Such sanitary facilities shall be connected to approved plumbing. Such plumbing shall be sized, installed, and maintained in

accordance with the Florida Building Code. Wastewater or

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sewage shall be properly treated onsite or discharged into an approved sewage collection and treatment system.

- (6)(a) Each public food service establishment licensed on or after January 1, 2005, and each public food service establishment issued a renewal license on or after that date shall provide a diaper-changing table in each properly designated public bathroom, except that if it is determined by the division that a public food service establishment has public bathrooms that are too small to accommodate a diaper-changing table or that the installation of a diaper-changing table would impede the public food service establishment's compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, the establishment need not provide a diaper-changing table. The division shall adopt rules to administer this paragraph.
- (b) As used in this subsection, the term

 'diaper-changing table" means a sturdy table or an elevated

 surface that has a changing surface that is at least 36 inches
 above floor level and is not used for any purpose other than
 diaper changing. In addition, the diaper-changing table must
 be adjacent to or near the bathroom sink, must have a clean,
 moisture-proof surface, must be sturdy and maintained in good
 repair, and must be kept free of all objects except those used
 for diaper changing.
- (c) The division must establish by rule procedures for inspecting diaper-changing tables and procedures for disinfecting diaper-changing tables and disposing of soiled diapers.

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         The committee substitute requires a diaper-changing table in each properly designated public bathroom. It exempts from the requirement any public bathroom in a public food service establishment that the Division of Hotels and Restaurants (division) determines is too small to accommodate a diaper-changing table or that the installation of the table would impede compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The committee substitute authorizes the division to adopt rules to administer the diaper-changing table requirement.

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         The committee substitute exempts from the diaper-changing table requirement any public food service establishment that is licensed as an alcoholic beverages vendor under s. 565.02(1)(b)-(f), F.S., or is an establishment that prohibits persons under 18 years of age on the premises. The committee substitute deletes the exceptions from the public bathroom
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          requirement.
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
