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Amendment (with title amendment)

Between lines 3623 and 3624, insert:

Section 42. (1) The Legislature finds that many of our state's hospitals are incurring millions of dollars in costs for treating uninsured persons.

- (2)(a) The Florida Uninsured Health Care Task Force is established for the purpose of investigating how to reduce the cost of treating uninsured persons.
- (b) The task force shall be comprised of one representative each from:
- 1. The Florida Medical Association, appointed by the board of governors of the association.
- 2. The Florida Dental Association, appointed by the board of trustees of the association.

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- 3. The Florida College of Emergency Physicians, appointed by the board of directors of the college.
- 4. The Florida Academy of Family Practitioners, appointed by the governing authority of the academy.
- 5. The Central Florida Partnership on Health Disparities, appointed by the governing authority of the partnership.
- 6. The Department of Health, appointed by Secretary of Health.
- 7. The Agency for Health Care Administration, appointed by the Secretary of Health Care Administration.
- 8. The Florida Association of Community Health Centers, appointed by the board of directors of the association.
- 9. The Florida Chamber of Commerce, appointed by the board of directors of the chamber.
- 10. The Florida Hospital Association, appointed by the board of trustees of the association.
- 11. The Teaching Hospitals Council, appointed by the governing authority of the council.
- 12. A public hospital more than 25 percent of the health care services of which are provided to persons who are subjects of charity, appointed by the governing authority of the hospital. The hospital shall be designated by the board of trustees of the Florida Hospital Association.
 - (c)1. The task force shall:
- a. Study the gaps in access to health care between the uninsured and those with health insurance.

- b. Identify inexpensive insurance packages for the uninsured that are advertised on television, radio, printed media, and the Internet.
- c. Study who the uninsured are among the working poor, small business owners, Medicaid recipients, migrant workers, illegal immigrants, and underinsured persons who spend more than 10 percent of their annual income on health care.
- d. Study how providers serve the uninsured, including, but not limited to, how and where the uninsured receive health care and why they receive health care from certain places.
- e. Research available federal funding that might provide assistance, including, but not limited to, the community health clinics grant.
- <u>f.</u> Identify funding alternatives which provide the greatest access to federal matching money.
- g. Develop a cost-effective model for treating the uninsured and reducing costs in hospitals and other facilities or groups in this state that provide health care services to the uninsured.
- 2. The task force shall develop innovative solutions for treating the uninsured, reducing the caseloads in the emergency rooms of our hospitals, and streamlining the resources, treatment centers, community health centers, county health clinics, and other health care facilities that treat uninsured persons.
- (3) The task force shall select a chair and shall meet at the call of the chair but at least once each month. Membership on the task force shall be voluntary and a vacancy shall be

- filled in the same manner as the original appointment. Members shall serve without compensation.
 - (4) The Department of Health and the Agency for Health

 Care Administration shall jointly provide staff to assist the

 task force in fulfilling its responsibilities.
 - (5) The task force shall develop solutions, make recommendations, and report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives at the beginning of the 2005 Regular Session. The task force shall cease to exist May 6, 2005.
