House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to extend the State Children's Health Insurance Program and appropriate sufficient funds to allow each state, using an appropriate match, to extend health care coverage to every child in America.

WHEREAS, Florida is the fourth most populous state, with 16.4 million residents, and

WHEREAS, more than 2 million Floridians live in poverty and approximately 2.8 million Floridians have no health insurance whatsoever, and

WHEREAS, the Kaiser Family Foundation reports that 17 percent of Florida children are currently uninsured, and

WHEREAS, it is a moral incumbency that every Floridian, especially children, have access to quality, affordable health care, and

WHEREAS, more than 250,000 children are currently insured through the Florida KidCare program, yet hundreds of thousands of children continue to go without quality health care, and

WHEREAS, the Florida KidCare program is funded in large part by federal contributions from the State Children's Health Insurance Program, and

WHEREAS, the State Children's Health Insurance Program is set to expire in federal fiscal year 2007, unless reauthorized by the United States Congress, and

WHEREAS, the Florida KidCare program, with additional longterm funding from the United States Congress through the State Children's Health Insurance Program, has the potential of expanding health insurance, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the Congress of the United States is urged to pass legislation during the 108th Congress to extend the State Children's Health Insurance Program beyond federal fiscal year 2007.
