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12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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14	Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 24.115, Florida
15	Statutes, is amended to read:
16	24.115 Payment of prizes
17	(2) Eighty percent of all unclaimed prize money shall
18	be deposited in the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund
19	consistent with the provisions of s. 24.121(2). The remaining
20	20 percent of All unclaimed prize money shall be added to the
21	pool from which future prizes are to be awarded or used for
22	special prize promotions.
23	Section 2. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 24.121,
24	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
25	24.121 Allocation of revenues and expenditure of funds
26	for public education
27	(1) <u>Variable percentages</u> As nearly as practical, at
28	least 50 percent of the gross revenue from the sale of on-line
29	and instant lottery tickets and variable percentages, as
30	determined by the department, of the gross revenue from the
31	sale of instant lottery tickets shall be returned to the
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public in the form of prizes paid by the department or retailers as authorized by this act. The variable percentages of gross revenue from the sale of <u>on-line and</u> instant <u>lottery</u> tickets returned to the public in the form of prizes shall be established by the department in a manner designed to maximize the amount of funds deposited under subsection (2).

7 (2) Each fiscal year, at least 39 percent of the gross 8 revenue from the sale of on-line lottery tickets, variable 9 percentages of the gross revenue from the sale of on-line and 10 instant lottery tickets as determined by the department 11 consistent with subsection (1), and other earned revenue, excluding application processing fees, shall be deposited in 12 13 the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund, which is hereby created in the State Treasury to be administered by the 14 Department of Education. The Department of the Lottery shall 15 transfer moneys to the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund at 16 17 least once each quarter. Funds in the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund shall be used to the benefit of public education in 18 19 accordance with the provisions of this act. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, lottery revenues transferred to 20 21 the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund shall be reserved as needed and used to meet the requirements of the documents 22 authorizing the bonds issued by the state pursuant to s. 23 24 1013.68, s. 1013.70, or s. 1013.737 or distributed to school 25 districts for the Classrooms First Program as provided in s. 1013.68. Such lottery revenues are hereby pledged to the 26 payment of debt service on bonds issued by the state pursuant 27 to s. 1013.68, s. 1013.70, or s. 1013.737. Debt service 28 29 payable on bonds issued by the state pursuant to s. 1013.68, s. 1013.70, or s. 1013.737 shall be payable from, and is 30 31 secured by a first lien on, the first lottery revenues

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1 transferred to the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund in each 2 fiscal year. Amounts distributable to school districts that 3 request the issuance of bonds pursuant to s. 1013.68(3) are 4 hereby pledged to such bonds pursuant to s. 11(d), Art. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. 16 17 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR 18 19 Senate Bill 174 20 The Committee Substitute requires that eighty percent of all unclaimed prize money be deposited in the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund. The remaining twenty percent of 21 22 unclaimed prize money shall be added to the pool from which future prizes are to be awarded or used for special prize promotions. 23 24 The Committee Substitute authorizes the Department of the Lottery to pay variable percentages of receipts from the sale of on-line and instant lottery tickets to the public in the form of prizes and to the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund. The Committee Substitute removes language guaranteeing certain percentages must be returned as prizes to the public and certain percentages must be deposited in the Educational 25 26 27 Enhancement Trust Fund. 28 29 30 31 3

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
