- (b) Multiservice senior centers that provide automated external defibrillators shall ensure that personnel are properly trained in accordance with s. 401.2915.
- (c) The location of each automated external defibrillator shall be registered with a local emergency medical services medical director.
- (d) The use of automated external defibrillators by employees and volunteers shall be covered under the provisions of ss. 768.13 and 768.1325.
- (e) The department may adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section.

Section 3. The sum of \$270,000 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Elderly Affairs for the purpose of implementing this act during the 2004-2005 fiscal year. The department shall arrange for the purchase of as many automated external defibrillators as may be purchased with available funds. Senior centers shall reimburse the department for 50 percent of the cost of the automated external defibrillator provided to their facility.

Multiservice senior centers located in rural communities, as defined in section 288.0656(2)(b), Florida Statutes, shall not be required to reimburse the department for the costs of such equipment. The department shall authorize issuance of the

equipment to senior centers in the order in which they request one and shall provide authorization for only one to each multiservice center pursuant to this section. Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR CS Senate Bill 1748 The Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for SB 1748 differs as follows from the underlying committee substitute: Clarifies that the location of an automated external defibrillator must be registered with a local emergency medical services medical director; and Takes effect upon becoming a law.
