Section 1. Records obtained by the Department of Revenue pursuant to s. 409.25659, Florida Statutes, are confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. However, such records may be disclosed only for the purpose of locating an individual or establishing, modifying, or enforcing a support obligation.

Section 2. This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, Florida Statutes, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 3. The Legislature finds it is a public necessity that insurance claims information reported to the Department of Revenue under s. 409.25659, Florida Statutes, be held confidential and exempt from disclosure as a public record because the information is personal and of a private nature, and disclosure could create the opportunity for identity theft, fraudulent activity concerning a claim, unauthorized solicitations by attorneys, unauthorized practice of law, and

unfair competition by revealing industry claims experience, and

confidentiality promotes insurer compliance by protecting

confidential insurer and consumer information.

Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law

if HB 1759 or similar legislation is adopted in the same

legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
