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- (b) Only members who possess expertise in state or national telecommunications policy, legal developments, and technical matters may be appointed.
- (c) A person who works directly for or who performs contract work for a telecommunications company may not be appointed.
- (d) Members shall serve without compensation but shall be entitled to reimbursement of travel and per diem expenses pursuant to s. 112.061, Florida Statutes, relating to completing their duties and responsibilities under this section.
 - (3) The task force shall:
- (a) Survey existing national and state regulatory, rate, and tax policies relating to the telecommunications industry.
- (b) Provide the Legislature with a concise presentation of the telecommunications policy landscape.
- (c) Identify and make recommendations relating to key tax and regulatory issues that the Legislature and the Public Service Commission should address, consistent with the principles enumerated in subsection (4).
- (d) Make specific recommendations for the Legislature's consideration.
- (4) In conducting its investigations, deliberating, and making recommendations, the task force shall consider the following principles:
- (a) The state should pursue policies that seek to maximize access by residents of this state to the widest number of technologies. At a minimum, all residents of this state should have access to affordable telephone service.

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- (b) Recommendations should be revenue neutral or revenue reducing; that is, revenues generated from telecommunications taxes in the aggregate should in no case exceed projected aggregate revenues if no changes in policies are made.
- (c) Taxes and regulations should be applied equitably; that is, government policies should not favor certain technologies over others and should not create or allow competitive inequities among providers or users of communications services.
- (d) Government intervention should be avoided to the greatest extent possible, except as necessary to ensure a predictable, competitive telecommunications environment that minimizes the likelihood of lawsuits, provides basic consumer protections, and provides all residents of this state with access to affordable telephone service.
- (e) Competition should be encouraged among telecommunications companies and among telecommunications technologies.
- (5) The task force shall select a chair and vice chair and shall meet at the call of the chair or as often as necessary to accomplish the purposes of this section.
- (6) The Public Service Commission shall provide administrative support and staff for the task force.
- (7) The task force shall prepare a report containing a summary of its investigations and deliberations and any recommendations and submit the report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by November 30, 2004.
