Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 373.117, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

373.117 Certification by <u>appropriate registered</u> professionals professional engineer.--

- conduct an activity regulated under this chapter requires the services of appropriate registered professionals a professional engineer as regulated and defined by law chapter 471, the department or governing board of a water management district may require, as a condition of granting a permit or license, that one or more professionals a professional engineer licensed under law chapter 471 certify upon completion of the permitted or licensed activity that such activity has been completed in substantial conformance with the plans and specifications approved by the department or board.
- (2) The cost of such certification by <u>appropriate</u> registered professionals a professional engineer shall be borne by the permittee.

(3) No permitted or licensed activity which is required to be so certified shall be placed into use or operation until the appropriate registered professionals' certificates or seals and signatures are professional engineer's certificate is filed with the department or board. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 1878 The committee substitute deletes language that included professional geologists in the provision of the Consultants Competitive Negotiation Act. It changes the provision that added professional geologists to the types of services required for certification of any activity regulated under the Florida Water Resources Act of 1972. The commmittee substitute now provides that the services may be performed by "appropriate registered professionals."
