An act relating to public records; amending s. 119.07, F.S.; creating an exemption from public records requirements for the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office, the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel, upon written request by the current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office, which must include official verification that the person has received a work-related threat to his or her life, health, or safety or to the life, health, or safety of a member of his or her family; providing for future review and repeal; providing a statement of public necessity; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Paragraph (i) of subsection (3) of section 119.07, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

(i)1. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of active or former law

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2004 HB 1925, Engrossed 1 enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from the provisions of subsection (1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of firefighters certified in compliance with s. 633.35; the home addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such firefighters; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such firefighters are exempt from subsection (1). The home addresses and telephone numbers of justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges; the home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of justices and judges are exempt from the provisions of subsection(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys,

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statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors are exempt from subsection (1)

and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.

- The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former human resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any local government agency or water management district whose duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related duties; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- 3. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former code enforcement

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officers; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such persons; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such persons are exempt from subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in

accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

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4.a. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of spouses and children of current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by children of current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office are exempt from subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, upon written request by the current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office, which must include official verification that the person has received a work-related threat to his or her life, health, or safety or to the life, health, or safety of a member of his or her family. For purposes of this sub-subparagraph, personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office are defined as personnel whose primary duties or responsibilities include performing laboratory and analytical work in criminal

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identification and investigation; photographing crime scenes;

classifying, evaluating, and identifying fingerprints; or

supervising one or more persons who have those duties or

responsibilities.

- b. Sub-subparagraph a. is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- 5.4. An agency that is the custodian of the personal information specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., or subparagraph 4. and that is not the employer of the officer, employee, justice, judge, or other person specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., or subparagraph 3., or subparagraph 4. shall maintain the confidentiality of the personal information only if the officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, or employing agency of the designated employee submits a written request for confidentiality to the custodial agency.

Section 2. The Legislature finds that the exemption from public records requirements provided by this act for the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office, the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel, when a written request for such exemption is made by the current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's

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office that includes official verification that the person has
received a work-related threat to his or her life, health, or
safety or to the life, health, or safety of a member of his or
her family, is a public necessity. This act is justified
because, if such information were not confidential, personnel of
a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office or their family
members could be harmed or threatened with harm by a criminal
defendant or by a friend or family member of a criminal
<u>defendant.</u>
