HR 1929 2004

House Resolution

A resolution urging Congress to grant temporary protected status to all nonimmigrant Haitian nationals living in the United States until peace and order are restored in Haiti.

WHEREAS, temporary protected status may be granted to eligible nationals of designated countries deemed to be in crisis, and

WHEREAS, Haiti is a nation currently in crisis, with lingering political turmoil and violent uprisings on the increase, and

WHEREAS, nonimmigrant Haitian nationals living in the United States may suffer reprisals, including injury or death, if deported back to Haiti under current conditions, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the Congress of the United States is requested to grant temporary protected status to all nonimmigrant Haitian nationals living in the United States until peace and order are restored in Haiti.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
