The bingo card shall have not fewer than 24 11 playing numbers printed on it. These playing numbers shall 12 range from 1 through 75, inclusive. More than one set of bingo 13 numbers may be printed on any single piece of paper.

(c) "Charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization" 14 15 means an organization which has qualified for exemption from 16 federal income tax as an exempt organization under the provisions of s. 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 17 or s. 528 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; 18 19 which is engaged in charitable, civic, community, benevolent, religious, or scholastic works or other similar activities; 20 21 and which has been in existence and active for a period of 3 22 years or more.

(d) "Deal" means a separate set or package of not more than 4,000 instant bingo tickets in which the predetermined minimum prize payout is at least 65 percent of the total receipts from the sale of the entire deal. (e) "Instant bingo" means a game that is played using tickets by which a player wins a prize by opening and removing a cover from the ticket to reveal a set of numbers, letters,
