11	SECTION 8. Limitation on amendments requiring state
12	government to spend in excess of ten million dollars per year
13	Each amendment proposed to this constitution that imposes a cost
14	on state government greater than \$10 million per state fiscal
15	year, as estimated in a manner provided by general law, shall
16	directly impose new state taxes or fees sufficient to fund the
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17 expenditures required by implementation of the amendment, including the cost of levying and collecting such taxes or fees. 18 The imposition of such taxes or fees shall not be deemed a 19 20 violation of the single-subject requirement of Section 3. No 21 amendment approved after the effective date of this section 22 shall be construed to require expenditures in excess of the 23 taxes or fees imposed by the amendment, but the legislature may 24 by general law revise the taxes and fees so imposed, provided such authority shall not affect the level of expenditures that 25 26 would otherwise be required by the amendment. The legislature 27 may, but need not, appropriate funds to implement the purposes of such amendments in amounts greater than the expenditures 28 required under the provisions of this section. A proposed 29 amendment subject to this section may not provide for an 30 exemption from this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of 31 32 this section, no tax upon estates or inheritances or upon the 33 income of any resident or citizen of the state, nor any other 34 tax prohibited by Article VII of this constitution, shall be 35 imposed by a revision or amendment proposed by initiative unless 36 the proposal embraces but one subject and matter directly 37 connected therewith. 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the title and substance of the 39 amendment proposed herein shall appear on the ballot as follows: 40 IMPOSING ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS ON PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS THAT REQUIRE 41 STATE SPENDING ABOVE A SPECIFIED AMOUNT 42 43 Proposes the creation of Section 8 of Article XI of the 44 State Constitution to require that any proposed constitutional 751859

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45 amendment requiring state government to spend more than \$10 46 million per fiscal year must identify a new revenue source 47 sufficient to pay for that increased spending. The increase in 48 state spending would be estimated according to a process 49 specified in general law. To identify a new revenue source, 50 such a proposed constitutional amendment would be required to 51 specify new state taxes or fees that would be imposed if voters 52 approved that amendment. Because adoption of such a proposed 53 constitutional amendment would impose new state taxes or fees, 54 the present requirements of Section 7 of Article XI of the State 55 Constitution would require that such proposed amendment be approved by at least two-thirds of those voting in the election 56 57 in which that proposed amendment is considered. Such an 58 amendment's imposition of new state taxes or fees pursuant to 59 this measure would not violate the single subject requirement of 60 Section 3 of Article XI, which regulated citizen initiative. 61 However, new inheritance, estate, income taxes, and other taxes 62 prohibited by Article VII would continue to be limited by a single subject requirement if proposed by citizen initiative. No 63 64 proposed constitutional amendment subject to this measure could 65 be construed to require state expenditures in excess of the 66 taxes or fees imposed by such an amendment. If such an amendment 67 were approved by the voters, the Legislature could by general 68 law revise or repeal the taxes or fees imposed by that amendment, but the expenditures otherwise required by the 69 70 amendment could not be affected. The Legislature could choose to 71 appropriate additional funds to implement the amendment beyond 72 those generated by the amendment's new state taxes or fees. No 751859

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73 proposed constitutional amendment subject to this measure could 74 exempt itself from the requirements of this measure. 75 76 77 Remove the entire title and insert: House Joint Resolution 78 79 A joint resolution proposing the creation of Section 8 of Article XI of the State Constitution to impose additional 80 requirements on proposed constitutional amendments that 81 require state spending above a specified amount. 82

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
