1 The Committee on Appropriations recommends the following: 2 3 Committee Substitute 4 Remove the entire bill and insert: 5 A bill to be entitled 6 An act relating to dental licensure; amending s. 466.006, 7 F.S.; allowing certain dental students to take the 8 examinations required to practice dentistry in this state 9 under specified conditions; providing a prerequisite to 10 licensure of such students; creating s. 466.0065, F.S.; 11 allowing certain dental students to take regional 12 licensure examinations under specified conditions; restricting the applicability of examination results to 13 14 licensing in other jurisdictions; requiring approval by the Board of Dentistry and providing prerequisites to such 15 approval; denying certain persons and entities standing to 16 17 assert right to administrative hearing proceedings; providing an effective date. 18 19 20 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 21 22 Subsection (2) of section 466.006, Florida Section 1. 23 Statutes, is amended to read:

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CS 466.006 Examination of dentists.--24 25 (2) An applicant shall be entitled to take the 26 examinations required in this section to practice dentistry in 27 this state if the applicant: (a) Is 18 years of age or older. 28 29 (b)1. Is a graduate of a dental school accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of the American Dental Association 30 or its successor agency, if any, or any other nationally 31 32 recognized accrediting agency; or-33 2. Is a dental student in the final year of a program at 34 such an accredited school who has completed all the coursework 35 necessary to prepare the student to perform the clinical and 36 diagnostic procedures required to pass the examinations. With 37 respect to a dental student in the final year of a program at a dental school, a passing score on the examinations is valid for 38 39 180 days after the date the examinations were completed. A dental school student who takes the licensure examinations 40 during the student's final year of an approved dental school 41 42 must have graduated before being certified for licensure 43 pursuant to s. 466.011. Has successfully completed the National Board of 44 (C) 45 Dental Examiners dental examination within 10 years of the date 46 of application. Section 2. Section 466.0065, Florida Statutes, is created 47 48 to read: 466.0065 Regional licensure examinations. --49 50 (1) It is the intent of the Legislature that schools of 51 dentistry be allowed to offer regional licensure examinations to

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52	dental students who are in the final year of a program at an							
53	approved dental school for the sole purpose of facilitating the							
54	student's licensing in other jurisdictions. This section does							
55	not allow a person to be licensed as a dentist in this state							
56	without taking the examinations as set forth in s. 466.006, nor							
57	does this section mean that regional examinations administered							
58	under this section may be substituted for complying with testing							
59	requirements under s. 466.006.							
60	(2) Each school of dentistry in this state which is							
61	accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of the American							
62	Dental Association or its successor agency may, upon written							
63	approval by the Board of Dentistry, offer regional licensure							
64	examinations only to dental students in the final year of a							
65	program at an approved dental school, if the board has approved							
66	the hosting school's written plan to comply with the following							
67	conditions:							
68	(a) A member of the regional examination body's board of							
69	directors or equivalent thereof must be a member of the American							
70	Association of Dental Examiners.							
71	(b) The student must have successfully passed parts I and							
72	II of the National Board of Dental Examiners examination within							
73	2 years before taking the regional examination.							
74	(c) The student must possess medical malpractice insurance							
75	in amounts not less than the amounts required to take the							
76	Florida licensure examinations.							
77	(d) At least one of the examination monitors must be a							
78	dentist licensed in this state who has completed all necessary							
79	standardization exercises required by the regional examination							
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CS 80 body. Recruitment of examination monitors is the responsibility 81 of the regional examination body. 82 (e) Adequate arrangements, as defined by the regional 83 examination body and as otherwise required by law, must be made, 84 when necessary, for patients who require followup care as a 85 result of procedures performed during the clinical portion of the regional examination. The regional examination body must 86 87 inform patients in writing of their right to followup care in 88 advance of any procedures performed by a student. 89 (f) The board chair or the chair's designee must be 90 allowed to observe testing while it is in progress. 91 (g) Each student, upon being deemed eligible by the dental 92 school to apply to the regional examination body to take the regional examination, must receive written disclosure in at 93 94 least 12-point boldface type that states: "This examination does 95 not meet the licensure requirements of chapter 466, Florida Statutes, for licensure in the State of Florida. Persons wishing 96 97 to practice dentistry in Florida must pass the Florida licensure 98 examinations." 99 (h) The student must be enrolled as a dental student in the student's final year of a program at an approved dental 100 101 school that is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of the American Dental Association or its successor agency. 102 103 (i) The student must have completed all coursework deemed 104 necessary by the dental school to prepare the student to perform 105 all clinical and diagnostic procedures required to pass the 106 regional examination.

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107 (j) The student's academic record must not include any 108 evidence suggesting that the student poses an unreasonable risk 109 to any live patients who are required for the clinical portion 110 of the regional examination. In order to protect the health and 111 safety of the public, the dental school may request additional 112 information and documents pertaining to the candidate's mental 113 and physical health in order to fully assess the candidate's 114 fitness to engage in exercises involving a live patient. 115 (3) A student who takes the examination pursuant to this 116 section, a dental school that submits a plan pursuant to this 117 section, or a regional examination body that a dental school

118 proposes to host under this section does not have standing to 119 assert that a state agency has taken action for which a hearing 120 may be sought under ss. 120.569 and 120.57.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.

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
