The original medical plan of treatment must be timely signed by 16 the physician, physician's assistant, or advanced registered 17 nurse practitioner, acting within his or her respective scope 18 19 of practice, and reviewed by him or her in consultation with the licensed nurse at least every 2 months. Any additional 20 order or change in orders must be obtained from the physician. 21 physician's assistant, or advanced registered nurse 22 23 practitioner and reduced to writing and timely signed by the 24 physician, physician's assistant, or advanced registered nurse 25 practitioner.
