Subsections (2) and (3) of section 1009.50, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 13 1009.50 Florida Public Student Assistance Grant 14 Program; eligibility for grants.--15 16 (2)(a) State student assistance grants through the 17 program may be made only to degree-seeking students who enroll in at least 3 6 semester hours, or the equivalent per term, 18 19 and who meet the general requirements for student eligibility 20 as provided in s. 1009.40, except as otherwise provided in 21 this section. The grants shall be awarded annually for the 22 amount of demonstrated unmet need for the cost of education 23 and may not exceed an amount equal to the average prior academic year cost of tuition fees, and other registration 24 25 fees, and assigned books and supplies for 40 30 credit hours at state universities or such other amount as specified in the 26 27 General Appropriations Act, to any recipient. A demonstrated unmet need of less than \$100 \$200 shall render the applicant 28 29 ineligible for a state student assistance grant. Recipients of 30 the grants must have been accepted at a state university or community college authorized by Florida law. A student is

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eligible for the award for 125 110 percent of the number of credit hours required to complete the program in which enrolled, except as otherwise provided in s. 1009.40(3).

- (b) A student applying for a Florida public student assistance grant shall be required to apply for the Pell Grant. The Pell Grant entitlement shall be considered when conducting an assessment of the financial resources available to each student.
- (c) Priority in the distribution of grant moneys shall be given to students with the lowest total family resources, in accordance with a nationally recognized system of need analysis. Using the system of need analysis, the department shall establish a maximum expected family contribution. An institution may not make a grant from this program to a student whose expected family contribution exceeds the level established by the department. An institution may not impose additional criteria to determine a student's eligibility to receive a grant award.
- (d) Each participating institution shall report, to the department by the established date, the eligible students to whom grant moneys are disbursed each academic term. Each institution shall also report to the department necessary demographic and eligibility data for such students.
- (3) Based on the unmet financial need of an eligible applicant, the amount of a Florida public student assistance grant must be between\$100\$200 and the weighted average of the cost of tuition and other registration fees for 40 30 credit hours at state universities per academic year or the amount specified in the General Appropriations Act.

Section 2. The sum of \$30 million is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Education for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act. Section 3.
