Effective December 31, 2005, section 24 25 120.55, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 120.55 Publication.--26 (1) The Department of State shall: 27 28 (a)1. Publish in a permanent compilation entitled "Florida Administrative Code" all rules adopted by each 29 30 agency, citing the specific rulemaking authority pursuant to

which each rule was adopted, all history notes as authorized

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in s. 120.545(9), and complete indexes to all rules contained in the code. Supplementation shall be made as often as practicable, but at least monthly. The department may contract with a publishing firm for the publication, in a timely and useful form, of the Florida Administrative Code; however, the department shall retain responsibility for the code as provided in this section. This publication shall be the official compilation of the administrative rules of this state. The Department of State shall retain the copyright over the Florida Administrative Code.

- Rules general in form but applicable to only one school district, community college district, or county, or a part thereof, or state university rules relating to internal personnel or business and finance shall not be published in the Florida Administrative Code. Exclusion from publication in the Florida Administrative Code shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of such rules.
- 3. At the beginning of the section of the code dealing with an agency that files copies of its rules with the department, the department shall publish the address and telephone number of the executive offices of each agency, the manner by which the agency indexes its rules, a listing of all rules of that agency excluded from publication in the code, and a statement as to where those rules may be inspected.
- 4. Forms shall not be published in the Florida Administrative Code; but any form which an agency uses in its dealings with the public, along with any accompanying instructions, shall be filed with the committee before it is used. Any form or instruction which meets the definition of "rule" provided in s. 120.52 shall be incorporated by 31 reference into the appropriate rule. The reference shall

specifically state that the form is being incorporated by reference and shall include the number, title, and effective date of the form and an explanation of how the form may be obtained. Each form created by an agency which is incorporated by reference after December 31, 2005, must clearly display the number, title, and effective date of the form and the number of the rule in which the form is incorporated.

- (b) <u>Electronically</u> publish <u>on an Internet website,</u>
 managed by the department and hosted by the State Technology

 <u>Office,</u> a weekly publication entitled the "Florida

 Administrative Weekly," which shall contain:
- 1. Notice of adoption of, and an index to, all rules filed during the preceding week.
- 2. All notices required by s. 120.54(3)(a), showing the text of all rules proposed for consideration or a reference to the location in the Florida Administrative Weekly where the text of the proposed rules is published.
- 3. All notices of public meetings, hearings, and workshops conducted in accordance with the provisions of s. 120.525, including a statement of the manner in which a copy of the agenda may be obtained.
- 4. A notice of each request for authorization to amend or repeal an existing uniform rule or for the adoption of new uniform rules.
- 5. Notice of petitions for declaratory statements or administrative determinations.
- 6. A summary of each objection to any rule filed by the Administrative Procedures Committee during the preceding week.
- 7. A cumulative list of all rules that have beenproposed but not filed for adoption.

Any other material required or authorized by law 2 or deemed useful by the department. 3 The department may contract with a publishing firm for printed 4 5 publication of the Florida Administrative Weekly and make 6 copies available on an annual subscription basis. 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- (a) Search for notices by type, publication date, rule number, word, subject, or agency;
- (b) Search a database that makes available all notices published on the website for a period of at least 5 years;
- Subscribe to an automated e-mail notification of selected notices; and
- Access agency forms incorporated by reference in (d) rules.
- (3) (3) Each agency shall provide copies of its rules upon request, with citations to the grant of rulemaking authority and the specific law implemented for each rule print or distribute copies of its rules, citing the specific rulemaking authority pursuant to which each rule was adopted.
- (4) Any publication of a proposed rule promulgated by an agency, whether published in the Florida Administrative Code or elsewhere, shall include, along with the rule, the name of the person or persons originating such rule, the name of the supervisor or person who approved the rule, and the date upon which the rule was approved.
- (5) Access to the Florida Administrative Weekly Internet website and its contents, including the e-mail notification service, shall be free for the public.
- (6) $\frac{(4)}{(a)}$ If the Florida Administrative Weekly is made available by the Department of State as a printed publication, the department shall furnish:
- (a) Copies of Each year the Department of State shall furnish the Florida Administrative Weekly, without charge and upon request, as follows:
- One subscription to each federal and state court having jurisdiction over the residents of the state; the 31 Legislative Library; each state university library; the State

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Library; each depository library designated pursuant to s. 257.05; and each standing committee of the Senate and House of Representatives and each state legislator.

- Two subscriptions to each state department.
- Three subscriptions to the library of the Supreme Court of Florida, the library of each state district court of appeal, the division, the library of the Attorney General, each law school library in Florida, the Secretary of the Senate, and the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
 - Ten subscriptions to the committee.
- The Department of State shall furnish One copy of the Florida Administrative Weekly, at no cost, to each clerk of the circuit court and each state department, for posting for public inspection.
- (7)(5)(a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund to be known as the "Publication Revolving Trust Fund" of the Department of State.
- (b) All fees and moneys collected by the Department of State under this chapter shall be deposited in the revolving trust fund for the purpose of paying for the publication and distribution of the Florida Administrative Code and the Florida Administrative Weekly and for associated costs incurred by the department in carrying out this chapter.
- (c) The unencumbered balance in the revolving trust fund at the beginning of each fiscal year may shall not exceed \$300,000, and any excess shall be transferred to the General Revenue Fund.
- (d) It is the intent of the Legislature that the Florida Administrative Weekly be supported entirely from funds collected for subscriptions to and advertisements in the 31 Florida Administrative Weekly. To that end, the Department of

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State is authorized to add a surcharge of 10 percent to any charge relating to the Florida Administrative Weekly until such time as the Publication Revolving Trust Fund has transferred to the General Revenue Fund an amount equal to all funds appropriated to the trust fund.

Section 2. Section 120.551, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

120.551 Internet publication.--

- (1) For purposes of this section, the term:
- "Agency" means the Department of Environmental Protection and the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund.
- "Internet website" means a centralized Internet (b) website that is established and maintained by the Department of Environmental Protection, is provided to the public without charge, and permits the public to:
- Search notices by type, publication date, program area, or rule number;
- 2. Search a permanent database that archives all notices published on the website; and
- Subscribe to an automated e-mail notification of selected notice types.
- Whenever the agency is required to publish notices in the Florida Administrative Weekly, the agency shall instead publish the complete notice on the Internet website. Notices published on the Internet website shall clearly state the date the notice was first published and shall be published only on the same days as the Florida Administrative Weekly is published. The Department of State shall publish a statement in the Florida Administrative Weekly that indicates the 31 specific URL or address for the Internet website. The agency

shall publish all other notices in the manner prescribed by 2 law. 3 (3) This section is repealed effective December 31, 4 2005 July 1, 2004, unless reviewed and reenacted by the 5 Legislature before that date. 6 Section 3. The Department of State shall, before 7 December 31, 2005, make available to all agencies required on the effective date of this act to publish materials in the 8 9 Florida Administrative Weekly training courses for the purpose 10 of assisting the agencies with their transition to publishing on the Florida Administrative Weekly Internet website. The 11 12 training courses may be provided in the form of workshops or software packages that allow self-training by agency 13 14 personnel. 15 Section 4. Except as otherwise expressly provided in 16 this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law. 17 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR 18 19 Senate Bill 2340 20 The committee substitute extends the implementation date for the Florida Administrative Weekly website from July 1, 2005, to December 31, 2005.
