Effective December 31, 2005, section 23 120.55, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 24 120.55 Publication.--25 (1) The Department of State shall: 26 Publish in a permanent compilation entitled 27 2.8 "Florida Administrative Code" all rules adopted by each 29 agency, citing the specific rulemaking authority pursuant to 30 which each rule was adopted, all history notes as authorized in s. 120.545(9), and complete indexes to all rules contained

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in the code. Supplementation shall be made as often as practicable, but at least monthly. The department may contract with a publishing firm for the publication, in a timely and useful form, of the Florida Administrative Code; however, the department shall retain responsibility for the code as provided in this section. This publication shall be the official compilation of the administrative rules of this state. The Department of State shall retain the copyright over the Florida Administrative Code.

- Rules general in form but applicable to only one school district, community college district, or county, or a part thereof, or state university rules relating to internal personnel or business and finance shall not be published in the Florida Administrative Code. Exclusion from publication in the Florida Administrative Code shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of such rules.
- At the beginning of the section of the code dealing with an agency that files copies of its rules with the department, the department shall publish the address and telephone number of the executive offices of each agency, the manner by which the agency indexes its rules, a listing of all rules of that agency excluded from publication in the code, and a statement as to where those rules may be inspected.
- Forms shall not be published in the Florida Administrative Code; but any form which an agency uses in its dealings with the public, along with any accompanying instructions, shall be filed with the committee before it is used. Any form or instruction which meets the definition of "rule" provided in s. 120.52 shall be incorporated by reference into the appropriate rule. The reference shall 31 specifically state that the form is being incorporated by

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reference and shall include the number, title, and effective date of the form and an explanation of how the form may be obtained. Each form created by an agency which is incorporated by reference in a rule noticed pursuant to s. 120.54(3)(a) after December 31, 2005, must clearly display the number, title, and effective date of the form and the number of the rule in which the form is incorporated.

- (b) <u>Electronically</u> publish <u>on an Internet website,</u> managed by the department, a weekly publication entitled the "Florida Administrative Weekly," which shall <u>serve as the official Internet website for such publication and shall contain:</u>
- 1. Notice of adoption of, and an index to, all rules filed during the preceding week.
- 2. All notices required by s. 120.54(3)(a), showing the text of all rules proposed for consideration or a reference to the location in the Florida Administrative Weekly where the text of the proposed rules is published.
- 3. All notices of public meetings, hearings, and workshops conducted in accordance with the provisions of s. 120.525, including a statement of the manner in which a copy of the agenda may be obtained.
- 4. A notice of each request for authorization to amend or repeal an existing uniform rule or for the adoption of new uniform rules.
- 5. Notice of petitions for declaratory statements or administrative determinations.
- 6. A summary of each objection to any rule filed by the Administrative Procedures Committee during the preceding week.

1 7. A cumulative list of all rules that have been 2 proposed but not filed for adoption. 3 8.7. Any other material required or authorized by law or deemed useful by the department. 4 5 6 The department may contract with a publishing firm for printed publication of the Florida Administrative Weekly and make 7 8 copies available on an annual subscription basis. All costs 9 related to the printed publication of the Florida 10 Administrative Weekly shall be funded solely by annual 11 subscription revenue. (c) Review notices for compliance with format and 12 numbering requirements before publishing them on the Florida 13 Administrative Weekly Internet website. 14 (d) (c) Prescribe by rule the style and form required 15 for rules submitted for filing and establish the form for 16 17 their certification. 18 (e) (d) Correct grammatical, typographical, and like 19 errors not affecting the construction or meaning of the rules, after having obtained the advice and consent of the 20 21 appropriate agency, and insert history notes. (e) Make copies of the Florida Administrative Weekly 22 available on an annual subscription basis computed to cover a 23 24 pro rata share of 50 percent of the costs related to the publication of the Florida Administrative Weekly. 25 (f) Charge each agency using the Florida 26 27 Administrative Weekly a space rate computed to cover a pro 28 rata share of 50 percent of the costs related to the Florida 29 Administrative Weekly and the Florida Administrative Code.

(g) Maintain a permanent record of all notices

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upon request, as follows:

furnish the Florida Administrative Weekly, without charge and

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- One subscription to each federal and state court having jurisdiction over the residents of the state; the Legislative Library; each state university library; the State Library; each depository library designated pursuant to s. 257.05; and each standing committee of the Senate and House of Representatives and each state legislator.
 - Two subscriptions to each state department.
- Three subscriptions to the library of the Supreme Court of Florida, the library of each state district court of appeal, the division, the library of the Attorney General, each law school library in Florida, the Secretary of the Senate, and the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
 - Ten subscriptions to the committee.
- The Department of State shall furnish One copy of the Florida Administrative Weekly, at no cost, to each clerk of the circuit court and each state department, for posting for public inspection.
- $(7)\frac{(5)}{(a)}$ There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund to be known as the "Publication Revolving Trust Fund" of the Department of State.
- (b) All fees and moneys collected by the Department of State under this chapter shall be deposited in the revolving trust fund for the purpose of paying for the publication and distribution of the Florida Administrative Code and the Florida Administrative Weekly and for associated costs incurred by the department in carrying out this chapter.
- (c) The unencumbered balance in the revolving trust fund at the beginning of each fiscal year may shall not exceed \$300,000, and any excess shall be transferred to the General Revenue Fund.

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 (d) It is the intent of the Legislature that the Florida Administrative Weekly be supported entirely from funds collected for subscriptions to and advertisements in the Florida Administrative Weekly. To that end, the Department of State is authorized to add a surcharge of 10 percent to any charge relating to the Florida Administrative Weekly until such time as the Publication Revolving Trust Fund has transferred to the General Revenue Fund an amount equal to all funds appropriated to the trust fund.

Section 2. Section 120.551, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

120.551 Internet publication. --

- (1) For purposes of this section, the term:
- (a) "Agency" means the Department of Environmental Protection and the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund.
- (b) "Internet website" means a centralized Internet website that is established and maintained by the Department of Environmental Protection, is provided to the public without charge, and permits the public to:
- 1. Search notices by type, publication date, program area, or rule number;
- 2. Search a permanent database that archives all notices published on the website; and
- 3. Subscribe to an automated e-mail notification of selected notice types.
- (2) Whenever the agency is required to publish notices in the Florida Administrative Weekly, the agency shall instead publish the complete notice on the Internet website. Notices published on the Internet website shall clearly state the date the notice was first published and shall be published only on

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the same days as the Florida Administrative Weekly is published. The Department of State shall publish a statement in the Florida Administrative Weekly that indicates the specific URL or address for the Internet website. The agency shall publish all other notices in the manner prescribed by law. This section is repealed effective December 31, 2005 July 1, 2004, unless reviewed and reenacted by the Legislature before that date. Section 3. The Department of State shall, before December 31, 2005, make available to all agencies required on the effective date of this act to publish materials in the Florida Administrative Weekly training courses for the purpose of assisting the agencies with their transition to publishing on the Florida Administrative Weekly Internet website. The training courses may be provided in the form of workshops or software packages that allow self-training by agency personnel. Section 4. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2004. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR CS/SB 2340 The committee substitute changes the requirement in the bill that the Department of State website allow internet access to agency forms incorporated in rules to instead require that the website allow viewing of agency forms incorporated in proposed rules.
