Be of a design that is shock resistant, water and 7 8 moisture proof, and capable of reliable function under normal atmospheric and environmental conditions. 9 h. Be capable of wear and use in a manner that does 10 11 not pose a safety hazard or unduly restrict the activities of 12 the defendant. 13 In addition, the transmitter must be capable of being attached 14 15 to the defendant in a manner that readily reveals any efforts 16 to tamper with or remove the transmitter upon visual inspection. Straps or other mechanisms for attaching the 17 transmitter to the defendant must be either capable of being 18 adjusted to fit a defendant of any size or made available in a 19 20 variety of sizes. 2. The contracted vendor providing the electronic 21 monitoring services shall furnish the bail bondsman with a 2.2 monitoring unit that meets certification standards approved by 23 the Federal Communications Commission unless otherwise 24 specified by state law. The monitoring unit must be capable of 25 receiving radio-frequency signals from the transmitter worn by 26 the defendant and described in subparagraph 1. The monitoring 27 28 unit must transmit data concerning the defendant's monitoring 29 status to a central monitoring system facility.
