Due to these unique needs for specialty services, any person who is not required to obtain registration 23 or certification pursuant to s. 489.105(3)(a)-(i) or (m)-(o) may 24 25 perform specialty contracting services for the construction, 26 remodeling, repair, or improvement of a swimming pool or spa as 27 specified in s. 489.105(3)(j)-(1) without obtaining a local 28 professional license if such person is supervised by a certified

29 or registered commercial pool/spa contractor, residential pool/spa contractor, or swimming pool/spa servicing contractor 30 acting within the scope of the supervising contractor's license. 31 A local authority that does not require a local specialty 32 contractor license or local certificate of competency for any 33 service provided by a certified or registered commercial 34 35 pool/spa contractor, residential pool/spa contractor, or swimming pool/spa servicing contractor must allow, as an 36 37 alternative to the local license or certificate, local 38 registration of the person contracting with a supervising 39 contractor to perform a specialty service under this paragraph. 40 The local authority may charge a fee for local registration 41 which does not exceed \$150. The local authority may not require 42 proof of competency for local registration and shall require 43 documentation that a registrant is covered by workers' 44 compensation coverage or a valid exemption from such coverage. 45 Local registration shall require the registrant to contract with 46 a certified or registered commercial pool/spa contractor, 47 residential pool/spa contractor, or swimming pool/spa servicing 48 contractor.
