29-1724-04 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to education; creating s. 1000.055, F.S., relating to safety for all 3 4 students; providing legislative findings with respect to harassment, discrimination, 5 6 possession of lethal weapons, and violence in 7 Florida schools; prohibiting specified conduct and providing for remedial measures; defining 8 9 the term "harassment"; providing duties of educational institutions; requiring the State 10 11 Board of Education to adopt rules; providing an 12 effective date. 13 14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 15 Section 1. Section 1000.055, Florida Statutes, is 16 17 created to read: 1000.055 Safety for all students.--18 19 (1) This section may be cited as the "Student Safety 20 and Violence Act." 21 (2) The Legislature finds that: 22 (a) Ensuring the safety of all students in this state is a compelling state interest. 23 (b) Harassment, discrimination, and violence are not 24 25 conducive to a learning environment and are sometimes a threat, and a reality, for students. When they occur, all 26 27 students in this state are adversely affected. 2.8 (c) There has been an increasing problem of children 29 possessing lethal weapons at school. 30 (d) Maintaining safety and discipline in schools is essential for the welfare of all students and for 31

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1 accomplishing the educational mission of schools. Harassment, discrimination, and violence interfere with efforts to ensure 2 3 that school environments are conducive to the safety and learning of all students. In this regard, the Legislature 4 5 recognizes its responsibilities: б 1. To enable all students to learn in a safe school 7 environment. 8 2. To ensure that every student is provided with a safe educational environment in which to learn. 9 10 (3) Harassment, discrimination, or violence against 11 any student or school employee, or the possession of a lethal weapon, by any student or school employee during the conduct 12 of any education program or activity by an educational 13 institution that receives or benefits from state or federal 14 financial assistance, as well as on any school bus traveling 15 to or from a school or a school-related or school-sponsored 16 17 program or activity is prohibited and includes, without limitation: 18 19 (a) Harassment and discrimination on the basis of 20 actual or perceived identity or expression of race, color, 21 religion, national origin, marital status, gender, disability, or sexual orientation; on the basis of stereotypes of persons 22 identified by these characteristics; or on the basis of 23 24 association with others identified by these characteristics. (b) Retaliation against a student by another student 25 or school employee for asserting or alleging a violation of 26 27 this section. 28 (4) This section does not limit rights or 29 responsibilities provided under any other provision of law. 30 31

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1 (5) "Harassment" as used in this section means verbal 2 or physical conduct directed at a student or group of students 3 that: (a) Substantially disrupts educational operations or 4 5 an individual student's opportunity to to be educated or б adversely affects his or her physical, emotional, or 7 psychological well-being; 8 (b) Does not serve a legitimate purpose; or 9 (c) Creates an intimidating or hostile environment that is sufficiently severe, pervasive, or objectively 10 11 offensive that it undermines, adversely affects, or detracts from the educational experience of the student or students. 12 This section does not preclude the student from 13 (6) taking any other appropriate action provided by law. This 14 section does not limit rights or responsibilities provided 15 under any other provision of law. This section does not limit 16 17 the rights afforded all persons by the Constitution of the United States or of the State of Florida. 18 19 (7) Educational institutions covered under this section shall develop and implement methods and strategies 20 21 for: 22 Providing procedures for the filing and the prompt (a) processing, hearing, and adjudication of claims of violations 23 of this section, as well as imposition of remedial measures. 24 25 (b) Providing instruction to teachers, school 26 administrators, and counseling staff on identifying, 27 preventing, and responding to all forms of harassment, 28 discrimination, and violence that are unlawful under this 29 section. 30 (c) Providing specific and continuing steps to 31 annually notify students, parents, and employees of

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harassment, discrimination, and violence unlawful under this section, and the procedures for reporting violations. This requirement may be satisfied by including this information in bulletins, handbooks, or other such materials that at least annually publish policies governing student and employee Promoting school environments that are free of harassment, discrimination, and violence unlawful under this (e) Reporting to the State Board of Education all incidents of harassment, discrimination, violence, and possession of lethal weapons by students in violation of this The State Board of Education shall adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer and monitor compliance with this section. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. ******
