The Committee on Criminal Justice recommended the following amendment:

Senate Amendment

On page 7, line 17, through
page 8, line 18, delete those lines

and insert:

(1)(a) A person may not knowingly operate a vessel, or authorize the operation of a vessel, in violation of the restrictions of a safety zone, security zone, regulated navigation area, or naval vessel protection zone as defined in and established pursuant to 33 C.F.R. part 165.

(b) The intent of this section is to provide for state and local law enforcement agencies to operate in federally designated exclusion zones specified in paragraph (a). State and local law enforcement personnel may enforce these zones at the request of a federal authority if necessary to augment federal law enforcement efforts and if there is a compelling need to protect the residents and infrastructure of this state. Requests for state and local law enforcement personnel

1 to enforce these zones must be made to the Department of Law
2 Enforcement through the Florida Mutual Aid Plan described in
3 s. 23.1231.

4 (2) A person who knowingly operates a vessel, or
5 authorizes the operation of a vessel, in violation of the
6 restrictions of such a safety zone, security zone, regulated
7 navigation area, or naval vessel protection zone commits a
8 misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s.
9 775.082 or s. 775.083.

10 (3) A person who continues to operate, or authorize
11 the operation of, a vessel in violation of the restrictions of
12 such a safety zone, security zone, regulated navigation area,
13 or naval vessel protection zone after being warned against
14 doing so, or who refuses to leave or otherwise cease violating
15 such a safety zone, security zone, regulated navigation area,
16 or naval vessel protection zone after having been ordered to
17 do so by a law enforcement officer or by competent military
18 authority, commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as
19 provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

20 (4) A person who knowingly enters a safety zone,
