(1) For purposes of this act: 16 17 "Sales floor" means any area where the public is invited to shop, whether indoors or outdoors. 18 19 "Working warehouse" means a wholesale or retail (b) 20 establishment in which: Heavy machinery, including, but not limited to, 21 22 forklifts, is used in any area where the public shops while customers are on the premises. 23 2. Merchandise is stored on shelves higher than 12 24 25 feet above the sales floor. 26 (2) The owner, manager, or operator of a working 27 warehouse shall secure merchandise stored on shelves higher 28 than 12 feet above the sales floor. Methods of securing 29 merchandise shall include, but not be limited to, rails, 30 fencing, netting, security doors, gates, cables, or the

metal or plastic banding, or by tying items together with a cord.

- (3) When heavy machinery is used to move merchandise on a shelf or remove merchandise from a shelf in a working warehouse, a safety zone shall be established around such shelf to temporarily block customers from entering the areas surrounding such shelf.
- (4)(a) Each owner of a working warehouse located in this state shall maintain a current and valid policy of casualty insurance, as defined in section 624.605, Florida Statutes, providing liability insurance for death, injury, or disability of customers shopping at the warehouse as a result of falling merchandise.
- (b) An owner, manager, or operator of a working warehouse who employs more than 50 employees shall submit to the Office of Insurance Regulation of the Financial Services Commission, within 30 days after December 31 of each year, a report of all known injuries requiring hospitalization, including emergency room medical treatment, or deaths occurring to customers as the result of falling merchandise. Each year, a corporation owning, managing, or operating more than one working warehouse may submit within 30 days after December 31 of such year, a single report on behalf of all of the corporation's working warehouses in this state, provided the report identifies the location of the warehouse where each reportable incident occurred.
- (5) All working warehouses shall comply with the provisions of this act on or before July 1, 2004.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
