Subsection (6) of section 550.2415, Florida 15 16 Statutes, is amended to read: 550.2415 Racing of animals under certain conditions 17 prohibited; penalties; exceptions.--18 19 (6)(a) It is the intent of the Legislature that 20 animals that participate in races in this state on which 21 pari-mutuel wagering is conducted and animals that are bred 22 and trained in this state for racing be treated humanely, both on and off racetracks, throughout the lives of the animals. 23 (b) The division shall, by rule, establish the 24 25 procedures for euthanizing greyhounds. However, a greyhound 26 may not be put to death by any means other than by lethal 27 injection of the drug sodium pentobarbital. A greyhound may 28 not be removed from this state for the purpose of being 29 destroyed. 30 (c) It is a violation of this chapter for an 31 occupational licensee to train a greyhound using live or dead 1

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animals. A greyhound may not be taken from this state for the purpose of being trained through the use of live or dead animals. (d) A conviction of cruelty to animals pursuant to s. 828.12 involving a racing animal constitutes a violation of this chapter. The division shall maintain accurate records and (e) statistics regarding injuries incurred by greyhounds that race in this state. The division shall adopt rules requiring the reporting of injuries incurred by greyhounds while racing in this state, including schooling races. Such reports must include: The greyhound's registered name and right and left 1. ear tattoo numbers. The name, business address, and telephone number of 2. the greyhound owner, trainer, and kennel operator. 3. The color, weight, and sex of the greyhound. The specific type of injury, the cause of the 4. injury, the estimated recovery time, and the location of the injury on the greyhound. Where the injury occurred, whether on a racing 5. track or in another area. 6. If the injury occurred while the greyhound was

24 racing, the racetrack where the injury occurred; the distance, 25 grade, race, and post position when the injury occurred; and 26 the weather conditions, time, temperature, and track condition 27 at the time of the injury.

28 <u>7. A certification by the racetrack veterinarian that</u>
29 <u>the form is correct.</u>

30 (f) The division shall maintain accurate records and

31 statistics regarding the disposition of greyhounds that

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1 participate in racing in this state. The division shall adopt rules requiring the reporting of the disposition of greyhounds 2 3 that race in this state, including schooling races. As used in the reporting requirement, the term "disposition" means death, 4 5 transfer to another jurisdiction, retirement, adoption, sale, б or donation for medical research or another purpose. Such 7 reports must include: 8 1. The greyhound's registered name and right and left 9 ear tattoo numbers; the name, business address, and telephone number of the greyhound owner, trainer, and kennel operator; 10 11 and the name and address of the race track where the greyhound last raced prior to disposition. 12 2. If the greyhound was transferred to another track, 13 the name and address of the track that received the greyhound 14 and the name, business address, telephone number, and driver's 15 license number and state of issuance of the person who 16 17 received the greyhound on behalf of that track. If the greyhound was retired for breeding, the name 18 3. 19 and address of the facility that received the greyhound and the name, business address, telephone number, and driver's 20 21 license number and state of issuance of the person who received the greyhound on behalf of that facility. 22 4. If the greyhound was adopted or placed for 23 24 adoption, the name and address of the person that received the greyhound and, if applicable, the name, business address, 25 telephone number, and driver's license number and state of 26 27 issuance of the person who received the greyhound on behalf of 28 the adoption facility. 29 If the greyhound was euthanized, the name, address, 5. 30 professional title, professional affiliation of the person 31

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1 performing the euthanasia, method of euthanasia, and reason the greyhound was euthanized rather than adopted. 2 3 6. If the greyhound was sold or donated, the name of 4 the person to whom the greyhound was sold or donated, and if donated, the name, business address, telephone number, and 5 б driver's license number and state of issuance of the person 7 who received the greyhound on behalf of the donee. 8 7. If the disposition of the greyhound does not fit into any of the above categories, the name of the person to 9 10 whom the greyhound was transferred, and the name, business 11 address, telephone number, and driver's license number and state of issuance of the person who received the greyhound. 12 8. Certification by the owner, trainer, and kennel 13 14 operator that the disposition forms are correct. 15 The division shall maintain injury and disposition (g) records for 7 years. 16 17 In addition to other penalties imposed by law, a (h) person who knowingly makes a false statement on an injury or 18 19 disposition form commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. A person 20 who knowingly makes a false statement on an injury or 21 22 disposition form on a second or subsequent occasion commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 23 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 24 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. 26 27 28 SENATE SUMMARY Requires the Division of Pari-mutuel Wagering to maintain certain records regarding injuries to and the disposition of racing greyhounds.
