- Section 1. Appearance card required for testifying before a legislative committee; implied oath.--
- (1) For purposes of this section, the term "legislative committee" means any committee, subcommittee, select committee, conference committee, joint committee, or council of either or both chambers of the Legislature.
- (2) A person who testifies before a legislative committee shall be considered to be under oath and, if he or she willfully

testifies falsely, is subject to penalties for perjury as provided by law.

- (3) Before testifying before a legislative committee, a person must complete an appearance card that includes, but need not be limited to, the person's name and address, the organization that he or she represents, if any, and the person's signature. The card must contain a notice, printed in legible type and located above the signature line, which states that by signing the card the person acknowledges being under oath and subject to penalties for perjury if he or she does not testify truthfully.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
