Orange County Parental Involvement Pilot 8 Project. --(1) In accordance with the provisions of subsection 9 10 4) and for the 2004-2005 fiscal year only, the Department of 11 Juvenile Justice is authorized to allow any parent who, pursuant to an order of the circuit court in and for Orange 12 County, is subject to the provisions of section 985.215(6), 13 section 985.231(1)(b), or section 985.233(4)(d), Florida 14 Statutes, relating to the fees associated with the cost of a 15 child's care or supervision by the department, to attend and 16 17 participate in a course of parenting education classes which is approved by the department in lieu of paying all or a 18 19 portion of such fees. The department is authorized to develop a reasonable and uniform formula for specifying a number of 20 participation hours in lieu of the \$5 per day fee. 21 The department shall notify parents who, pursuant 22 (2) to an order of the circuit court in and for Orange County, are 23 24 obliged to pay fees associated with the cost of the child's 25 care or supervision by the department, of the option to participate in the pilot project by attending and 26 27 participating in a course of parenting education classes. The notification shall include a description of the course 28 29 contents and the number of participation hours that the parent will be required to successfully complete in order to receive 30 31 a waiver of such fees pursuant to subsection (4).

5	provide the notification to parents who are the subject of

7	have a current or delinquent obligation to pay the required
8	fees.
9	(3) If the Department of Juvenile Justice does not
10	already have such classes in place and available in Orange
11	County, the department may contract with a private or public
12	entity in Orange County to provide classes in parenting

14	public entity must have appropriate expertise in providing

1 violation of law for which the child has been placed under the care or supervision of the department and that the parent is 2 3 cooperating or has cooperated with the investigation of the 4 act or violation. 5 The court may authorize the parent to participate (b) б in a course of parenting education classes in lieu of paying 7 all or a portion of the required fees, subject to the 8 provisions of subsection (4). If the parent's obligation to pay fees exceeds \$450, the court may reduce or waive the 9 10 remaining fees in accordance with the provisions of section 11 985.215(6), section 985.231(1)(b), or section 985.233(4)(d), Florida Statutes, upon verification by the department that the 12 parent has successfully completed the course of parenting 13 14 education classes. The department shall identify measurable outcomes 15 (7)for the pilot project, including, but not limited to, the 16 17 following: (a) The number of parents who participate in parenting 18 19 education classes in lieu of paying the required fees. 20 (b) The number of parents who successfully complete 21 such classes. Whether any child of a participating parent is 22 (C) referred to the department during the 2004-2005 fiscal year 23 24 subsequent to the referral associated with the parent's 25 initial participation in the parenting education classes. 26 27 The department shall report these outcomes, together with the 28 outcomes of any other measures deemed appropriate, to the 29 Legislature and Governor by October 1, 2005.
