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23 464.203 Certified nursing assistants; certification 24 requirement.--

(1) The board shall issue a certificate to practice as a certified nursing assistant to any person who demonstrates a minimum competency to read and write, who and successfully passes the required <u>background screening pursuant to subsection</u> (8), Level I or Level II screening pursuant to s. 400.215 and who meets one of the following requirements:

(a) Has successfully completed an approved training program and achieved a minimum score, established by rule of the board, on the nursing assistant competency examination, which consists of a written portion and skills-demonstration portion approved by the board and administered at a site and by personnel approved by the department.

(b) Has achieved a minimum score, established by rule of the board, on the nursing assistant competency examination, which consists of a written portion and skills-demonstration portion, approved by the board and administered at a site and by personnel approved by the department and:

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Has a high school diploma, or its equivalent; or
 Is at least 18 years of age.

(c) Is currently certified in another state; is listed on that state's certified nursing assistant registry; and has not been found to have committed abuse, neglect, or exploitation in that state.

48 (d) Has completed the curriculum developed under the
49 Enterprise Florida Jobs and Education Partnership Grant and
50 achieved a minimum score, established by rule of the board, on

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51 the nursing assistant competency examination, which consists of 52 a written portion and skills-demonstration portion, approved by 53 the board and administered at a site and by personnel approved 54 by the department.

55 <u>(8)</u> For purposes of this section, background screening 56 includes:

57(a) For all persons, a screening for violation of any of58the grounds for disciplinary action specified in s. 464.204.

59 (b) For persons who have maintained continuous residency 60 in the state for the 5 years immediately preceding the date of 61 screening, a Level I screening as provided in chapter 435.

62 (c) For persons who have not maintained continuous
 63 residency in the state for the 5 years immediately preceding the
 64 date of screening, a Level II screening as provided in chapter
 65 435.

66 (9) Beginning January 1, 2005, the Department of Health 67 and the Agency for Health Care Administration shall, after 68 certification of an applicant, ensure that the information 69 related to the background screening of that applicant is posted 70 on the agency's Internet website in its background screening 71 database, which shall be available to employers and prospective 72 employers.

73 Section 2. Subsection (4) of section 400.211, Florida74 Statutes, is amended to read:

400.211 Persons employed as nursing assistants;

77 (4) When employed by a nursing home facility for a 12-78 month period or longer, a nursing assistant, to maintain

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79 certification, shall submit to a performance review every 12 80 months and must receive regular inservice education based on the 81 outcome of such reviews. The inservice training must: 82 (a) Be sufficient to ensure the continuing competence of nursing assistants, must be at least 18 hours per year, and may 83 84 include hours accrued under s. 464.203(7).(8); 85 Include, at a minimum: (b) 86 1. Techniques for assisting with eating and proper feeding.+ 87 2. Principles of adequate nutrition and hydration.+ 88 89 3. Techniques for assisting and responding to the 90 cognitively impaired resident or the resident with difficult behaviors.+ 91 92 Techniques for caring for the resident at the end-of-4. life.; and 93 94 Recognizing changes that place a resident at risk for 5. pressure ulcers and falls.; and 95 Address areas of weakness as determined in nursing 96 (C) 97 assistant performance reviews and may address the special needs 98 of residents as determined by the nursing home facility staff. 99 100 Costs associated with this training may not be reimbursed from additional Medicaid funding through interim rate adjustments. 101 Subsection (5) of section 400.215, Florida 102 Section 3. Statutes, is amended to read: 103 400.215 Personnel screening requirement.--104 105 Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding, (5) persons who have been screened and qualified as required by this 106

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107 section or s. 464.203 and who have not been unemployed for more than 180 days thereafter, and who under penalty of perjury 108 109 attest to not having been convicted of a disqualifying offense 110 since the completion of such screening, shall not be required to 111 be rescreened. For purposes of this subsection, screened and qualified under s. 464.203 means that the person subject to such 112 113 screening at the time of certification by the Board of Nursing does not have any disqualifying offense under chapter 435 or has 114 115 received an exemption from any disqualification under chapter 116 435 from the Board of Nursing. An employer may obtain, pursuant 117 to s. 435.10, written verification of qualifying screening 118 results from the previous employer or other entity which caused 119 such screening to be performed.

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Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
