Paragraph (i) of subsection (3) of section 119.07, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 20 21 119.07 Inspection, examination, and duplication of 22 records; exemptions.--23 (3) (i)1. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 24 25 security numbers, and photographs of active or former law enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional 26 27 probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children 28 and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal 29 30 activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties 31 are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, 1

1 and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local 2 governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection 3 and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 4 5 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and б children of such personnel; and the names and locations of 7 schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from the provisions of subsection 8 (1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of 9 10 firefighters certified in compliance with s. 633.35; the home 11 addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such firefighters; 12 and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities 13 attended by the children of such firefighters are exempt from 14 subsection (1). The home addresses and telephone numbers of 15 justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal 16 17 judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges; the home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of 18 19 the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names 20 and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 21 the children of justices and judges are exempt from the provisions of subsection (1). The home addresses, telephone 22 numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current 23 24 or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, 25 statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 26 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 27 28 children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state 29 attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; and the names and locations of schools and day 30 31 care facilities attended by the children of current or former

1 state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide 2 prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors are exempt 3 from subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State 4 Constitution.

5 The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 2. 6 security numbers, and photographs of current or former human resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, 7 8 assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any 9 local government agency or water management district whose 10 duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract 11 negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related duties; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social 12 security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the 13 spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and 14 locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the 15 children of such personnel are exempt from subsection (1) and 16 17 s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in 18 19 accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 20 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through 21 reenactment by the Legislature.

The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 22 3. security numbers, and photographs of current or former United 23 24 States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; the 25 home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 26 27 children of current or former United States attorneys and 28 assistant United States attorneys; and the names and locations 29 of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United 30 31 States attorneys are exempt from subsection (1) and s. 24(a),

The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 25 security numbers, and photographs of current or former code enforcement officers; the names, home addresses, telephone 26 numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of 27 28 employment of the spouses and children of such persons; and 29 the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such persons are exempt from 30 31 subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.

An agency that is the custodian of the personal б information specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., or 7 subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., or subparagraph 5., and that 8 is not the employer of the officer, employee, justice, judge, 9 or other person specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., <del>or</del> subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., or subparagraph 5., 10 11 shall maintain the confidentiality of the personal information only if the officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, 12 13 or employing agency of the designated employee submits a written request for confidentiality to the custodial agency. 14 Section 2. The Legislature finds that the exemption 15 from public-records requirements provided for by this act for 16 identifying information relating to current and former United 17 States attorneys, assistant United States attorneys, judges of 18 19 the United States Courts of Appeal, United States district 20 judges, United States magistrate judges, and their families is a public necessity. This act is justified because, if such 21 information were not confidential, a United States attorney, 22 an assistant United States attorney, a judge of the United 23 24 States Court of Appeal, a United States district judge, a 25 United States magistrate judge, or his or her family could be harmed or threatened with harm by a criminal defendant or by a 26 friend or family member of a criminal defendant. 27 28 Section 3.
