Florida Families Faith-Based Institute. --14 (1) CREATION. -- The Florida Families Faith-Based 15 16 Institute is created at and shall be administered by the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University. The 17 Legislature determines that public policy dictates that the 18 19 Florida Families Faith-Based Institute operate in the most open and accessible manner consistent with its public purpose. 20 21 To this end, the Legislature specifically declares that the 22 Florida Families Faith-Based Institute is subject to the provisions of chapter 119, Florida Statutes, relating to 23 public records and the provisions of chapter 286, Florida 24 25 Statutes, relating to public meetings and records. (2) DEFINITION.--As used in this section, the term 26 27 "faith-based organization" means an organization that is owned 28 by, operated by, or affiliated with a religious entity and the 29 primary purpose of which is providing social services and 30 assistance to individuals in need of its services, without 31

regard to the race or religion of the person in need of such services.

- (3) DUTIES.--The Florida Families Faith-Based Institute shall:
- (a) Examine barriers to state-funded or federally funded provision of services by faith-based organizations.
- (b) Provide programmatic and managerial training and technical assistance to faith-based organizations that seek or use state or federal funds to provide services. Such training and technical assistance must focus on critical areas of faith-based social services management, including community asset-based program development, research-based best program practices, resource development for nonstate funding sources, and financial management and budgeting.
- (c) Establish a statewide resource center and clearinghouse for information related to technical assistance and training resources for faith-based and community-based organizations.
- (d) Serve, as required, as a fiscal intermediary for faith-based and community-based organizations that receive state funding.
- (e) To the maximum extent possible, leverage state funding for the institute with any federal funding that the institute may receive to support similar faith-based activities.
- (f) Provide specific goals and objective criteria to measure, evaluate, and document the quality and cost of services provided by faith-based organizations with state or federal funds.
- (g) Serve as liaison to the Centers for Faith-Based
 and Community Initiatives established within the United States

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    Department of Justice, United States Department of Health and
    Human Services, United States Department of Education, United
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    States Department of Labor, and United States Department of
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    Housing and Urban Development to work in tandem with the White
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    House Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives.
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    The Florida Families Faith-Based Institute shall perform its
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    duties without imposing fees on faith-based organizations that
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    receive its assistance.
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                 REPORT. -- By January 1 of each year, the institute
    shall submit to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and
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    the Speaker of the House of Representatives an annual report
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    that describes the activities of the institute in fulfilling
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    its duties, describes expenditures of funds by the institute,
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    and recommends to the President of the Senate and the Speaker
    of the House of Representatives changes to the Florida
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    Statutes that are necessary to fulfill its purposes and
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    duties.

                          Notwithstanding sections 216.181 and
    216.292, Florida Statutes, and pursuant to section 216.351,
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    Florida Statutes, the sum of $700,000 is appropriated to the
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    Florida Families Faith-Based Institute for purposes of
    administering this act during the 2004-2005 fiscal year.

                           This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
