Any 35 contract for sale must refer to and incorporate the disclosure 36 summary and must include, in prominent language, a statement 37 that the potential purchaser should not execute the contract until he or she has received and read the disclosure summary 38 39 required by this section. If the disclosure summary required by 40 this section has not been provided to the prospective purchaser 41 before executing the contract for sale, the contract is voidable 42 by the purchaser by delivering to the seller or the seller's 43 agent written notice of the purchaser's intention to cancel 44 either within 3 days after receipt of the disclosure summary or 45 3 days prior to closing, whichever occurs first.
