An act relating to vessel licenses; amending s. 372.09, F.S.; providing that revenues from freshwater fishing vessel licenses be deposited into the State Game Trust Fund; amending s. 372.57, F.S.; creating fishing vessel licenses for persons taking freshwater fish or carrying customers for the purpose of taking freshwater fish; providing for license fees; reenacting s. 372.562(2)(i) and (j), F.S., relating to certain exemptions from a requirement that a person obtain a fishing license or permit, to incorporate the amendment to s. 372.57, F.S., in references thereto; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 372.09, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
372.09 State Game Trust Fund.--The funds resulting from the operation of the commission and from the administration of the laws and regulations pertaining to birds, game, fur-bearing animals, freshwater fish, reptiles, and amphibians, including funds resulting from the sale of freshwater vessel licenses,together with any other funds specifically provided for such purposes shall constitute the State Game Trust Fund and shall be used by the commission as it shall deem fit in carrying out the provisions hereof and for no other purposes. The commission may not obligate itself

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beyond the current resources of the State Game Trust Fund unless specifically so authorized by the Legislature.

Section 2. Subsection (7) of section 372.57 , Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
372.57 Recreational licenses, permits, and authorization numbers; fees established.--
(7) VESSEL LICENSES.--
(a) $\underline{A}$ No person may not operate any vessel wherein a fee is paid, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of taking, attempting to take, or possessing any saltwater or freshwater fish for noncommercial purposes unless she or he has obtained a license for each vessel for that purpose, and has paid the license fee pursuant to paragraph paragraphs (b), and paragraph (c), or paragraph (d)for such vessel.
(b) A license for any person who operates any vessel licensed to carry more than 10 customers, wherein a fee is paid, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of taking or attempting to take saltwater or freshwater fish, is \$800 per year. The license must be kept aboard the vessel at all times.
(c)1. A license for any person who operates any vessel licensed to carry no more than 10 customers, or for any person licensed to operate any vessel carrying 6 or fewer customers, wherein a fee is paid, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of taking or attempting to take saltwater or freshwater fish, is $\$ 400$ per year.
2. A license for any person licensed to operate any vessel carrying 6 or fewer customers but who operates a vessel carrying 4 or fewer customers, wherein a fee is paid, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of taking or

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attempting to take saltwater or freshwater fish, is $\$ 200$ per
year. The license must be kept aboard the vessel at all times.
3. A person who operates a vessel required to be
licensed pursuant to paragraph (b),or this paragraph, or
paragraph (d)may obtain a license in her or his own name, and
such license shall be transferable and apply to any vessel
operated by the purchaser, provided that the purchaser has
paid the appropriate license fee.
(d) A license for any person who operates any vessel
licensed to carry any number of passengers, wherein a fee is
paid, either directly or indirectly, for the sole purpose of
catching and releasing freshwater fish, is $\$ 150$ per year. The
license must be kept aboard the vessel at all times.
(e) (d) A license for a recreational vessel not for
hire and for which no fee is paid, either directly or
indirectly, by guests for the purpose of taking or attempting
to take saltwater or freshwater fish noncommercially is $\$ 2,000$
per year. The license may be purchased at the option of the
vessel owner and must be kept aboard the vessel at all times.
A log of species taken and the date the species were taken
shall be maintained and a copy of the log filed with the
commission at the time of renewal of the license.
(f) (e) The owner, operator, or custodian of a vessel
the operator of which has been licensed pursuant to paragraph
(a) must maintain and report such statistical data as required
by, and in a manner set forth in, the rules of the commission.
Section 3. For the purpose of incorporating the
amendment made by this act to section 372.57 , Florida
Statutes, in references thereto, paragraphs (i) and (j) of
subsection (2) of section 372.562 , Florida Statutes, are
reenacted to read:
