1	468.901 Short titleThis part may be cited as the
2	"Genetic Counseling Practice Act."
3	468.902 Purpose and intentThe sole legislative
4	purpose in enacting this part is to ensure that every genetic
5	counselor practicing in this state meets minimum requirements
6	for safe practice. It is the legislative intent that genetic
7	counselors who fall below minimum competency or who otherwise
8	present a danger to the public shall be prohibited from
9	practicing in this state. This part does not require payment
10	from insurers for genetic counseling services.
11	468.903 DefinitionsAs used in this part, the term:
12	(1) "Board" means the Board of Genetic Counselors.
13	(2) "Department" means the Department of Health.
14	(3) "Genetic counselor" means a person licensed under
15	this part to practice genetic counseling.
16	(4) "Practice of genetic counseling" means, for
17	remuneration, the communication process that deals with the
18	human problems associated with the occurrence, or the risk of
19	occurrence, of a genetic disorder in a family, including the
20	provision of services to help an individual or family:
21	(a) Comprehend the medical facts, including the
22	diagnosis, the probable cause of the disorder, and the
23	available management of the disorder.
24	(b) Appreciate the way heredity contributes to the
25	disorder and the risk of occurrence in specified relatives.
26	(c) Understand the alternatives for dealing with the
27	risk of occurrence.
28	(d) Choose the course of action which seems
29	appropriate to them in view of their risk, their family goals,
30	and their ethical and religious standards, and to act in

1 (e) Make the best possible psychosocial adjustment to 2 the disorder in an affected family member or to the risk of 3 occurrence of that disorder. 4 468.904 License required. -- A person may not practice 5 genetic counseling or hold himself or herself out as a genetic 6 counselor or as being able to practice genetic counseling or 7 to render genetic counseling services in the state unless he 8 or she is licensed in accordance with this part. 9 468.905 Exemptions.--This part does not apply to: 10 (1) An individual licensed as a physician under 11 chapter 458 or chapter 459, acting in the authorized scope of the physician's practice. 12 (2) Commissioned medical officers of the Armed Forces 13 of the United States and of the Public Health Service of the 14 United States while on active duty and while acting within the 15 scope of their military or public health responsibilities. 16 17 468.906 Board of Genetic Counselors. --The Board of Genetic Counselors is created within 18 19 the department and shall consist of seven members, to be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. 20 21 (2) Five members of the board must be licensed genetic 22 counselors who are residents of the state. The remaining two members must be residents of the state who are not, and have 23 24 never been, licensed as genetic counselors or members of any 25 closely related profession. (3)(a) For the purpose of staggering terms, the 26 27 Governor shall appoint the initial members of the board as 28 follows: 29 Two licensee members and one consumer member for

9	468.907 Authority to adopt rules The board shall
10	adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to
11	administer the provisions of this part conferring duties on
12	it, including rules relating to standards of practice for
13	genetic counselors.
14	468.908 Licensure requirements; temporary license
15	(1) Any person desiring to be licensed as a genetic
16	counselor under this part must apply to the department on a
17	form approved by the department.
18	(2) The department shall license each applicant who:
19	(a) Has completed the application form and remitted
20	the required fees.
21	(b) Is of good moral character.
22	(c) Provides satisfactory documentation of having
23	earned:
24	1. A master's degree from a genetic counseling
25	training program or an equivalent program as determined by the
26	American Board of Genetic Counseling; or
27	2. A doctoral degree from a medical genetics training
28	program that is accredited by the American Board of Medical
29	Genetics.
30	(d) Has passed the examination for certification as:
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1	1. A genetic counselor by the American Board of
2	Genetic Counseling or the American Board of Medical Genetics;

6	(3) The department may issue a temporary license to an
7	applicant who meets all of the requirements for licensure
8	except the examination requirement in this section and has
9	obtained active candidate status establishing eligibility to
10	sit for the next available certification exam administered by
11	the American Board of Genetic Counseling.
12	468.909 Renewal of license; continuing education
13	(1) The department shall renew a license upon receipt
14	of the renewal application and fee.
15	(2) The board shall adopt rules establishing a
16	procedure for the biennial renewal of licenses under this
17	part.
18	(3) The board may by rule prescribe continuing
19	education requirements and approve course criteria, not to
20	exceed 30 hours biennially, as a condition for license
21	renewal. The board shall establish a procedure for approving
22	continuing education courses and providers and may set a fee
23	for continuing education courses and provider approval.
24	468.911 Fees
25	(1) The board shall by rule establish fees for the
26	following purposes:
27	(a) An application fee, not to exceed \$100.
28	(b) An initial licensure fee, not to exceed \$200.
29	(c) A biennial renewal fee, not to exceed \$200.
30	(d) An inactive fee, not to exceed \$100.
31	(e) A delinquent fee, not to exceed \$100.

1	(f) A reactivation fee, not to exceed \$100.
2	(g) A voluntary inactive fee, not to exceed \$100.
3	(2) The board shall establish fees at a level, not to
4	exceed the statutory fee cap, which is adequate to ensure the

- (b) Having a license to practice genetic counseling revoked, suspended, or otherwise acted against, including the denial of licensure in another jurisdiction.
- (c) Being convicted or found guilty of or pleading nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, in any jurisdiction, a crime that directly relates to the practice of genetic counseling, including a violation of federal laws or regulations regarding genetic counseling.
- is false, intentionally or negligently failing to file a report or record required by state or federal law, willfully impeding or obstructing such filing, or inducing another person to impede or obstruct such filing. Such reports or records include only reports or records that are signed in a person's capacity as a licensee under this act.
- (e) Advertising goods or services in a fraudulent, false, deceptive, or misleading manner.
- (f) Violating an order of the board or department previously entered in a disciplinary hearing or failing to comply with a subpoena issued by the board or the department.
- (g) Practicing with a revoked, suspended, or inactive license.
- (h) Gross or repeated malpractice or the failure to deliver genetic counseling services with that level of care and skill which is recognized by a reasonably prudent licensed practitioner with similar professional training as being acceptable under similar conditions and circumstances.
- (i) Unprofessional conduct, which includes, but is not limited to, any departure from, or the failure to conform to, the minimum standards of acceptable and prevailing genetic

counseling practice as set forth by the board in rules adopted pursuant to this part, including:

- 1. Engaging in any act or practice in a professional capacity which the licensee is not competent to perform through training or experience.
- 2. Failing to refer a client to other competent professionals when the licensee is unable or unwilling to adequately support or serve the client.
- 3. Failing to maintain the confidentiality of any information received from a client, unless released by the client or otherwise authorized or required by law.
- $\underline{4}$. Exploiting a client for personal advantage, profit, or interest.
- (j) Violating any provision of this part or chapter 456, or any rules adopted pursuant thereto.
- (2) The board may enter an order denying licensure or imposing any of the penalties in s. 456.072(2) against any applicant for licensure or licensee who is found guilty of violating any provision of subsection (1) or who is found guilty of violating any provision of s. 456.072(1).

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SENATE SUMMARY Creates the "Genetic Counseling Practice Act." Provides legislative purpose and intent. Provides definitions relating to genetic counseling. Requires licensure to practice genetic counseling. Provides exemptions from licensing. Creates the Board of Genetic Counselors and provides for the appointment and staggering of terms of its members. Requires the Board of Genetic Counselors to adopt rules. Provides licensure requirements. Provides for biennial renewal of licensure. Provides for continuing education. Authorizes the board to establish fees not to exceed specified caps. Prohibits certain acts and provides for penalties. Provides grounds for disciplinary action. Authorizes denial of licensure or imposition of other disciplinary actions authorized by law.
