Futch Memorial Highway 24 designated; department to erect suitable markers .--25 26 That portion of U.S. Highway 192 from Interstate (1)27 Highway 95 in Brevard County to St. Cloud in Osceola County is designated as "Howard E. Futch Memorial Highway." 28 29 The Department of Transportation is directed to (2) 30 erect suitable markers designating Howard E. Futch Memorial Highway as described in subsection (1). 31

St. Johns River Veterans Memorial Bridge designated; department to erect suitable markers .--(1) The St. Johns River Bridge on I-4 at the Seminole/Volusia County line is designated as the "St. Johns River Veterans Memorial Bridge." б The Department of Transportation is directed to (2) erect suitable markers designating the St. Johns River Veterans Memorial Bridge as described in subsection (1). Section 7. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. SENATE SUMMARY Provides road and bridge designations of the Browning-Pearce Memorial Highway, the Jerome A. Williams Memorial Highway, the James C. Penney Memorial Boulevard, the C. Fred and Marvin Arrington Bridge, and the Howard E. Futch Memorial Highway, and the St. Johns River Veterans Memorial Bridge. Provides for the erection of markers.
