Section 370.1203, Florida Statutes, is 13 created to read: 14 370.1203 Manatee Population Study Trust Fund. --15 (1) The Manatee Population Study Trust Fund is created 16 within the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission for the 17 purpose of providing funds for scientific studies of the 18 19 manatee or sea cow (Trichechus manatus). Trust fund moneys 20 shall be used exclusively for the purpose of conducting population, marine habitat, food source, and other scientific 21 22 studies of the manatee. Funds credited to the trust funds 23 consist of those funds annually appropriated from the Marine Fuel Tax and the Save the Manatee Trust Fund. 24 25 (2) In accordance with Section 19(f)(2) of Article III of the State Constitution, the trust fund shall be terminated 26 27 on July 1, 2008, unless terminated sooner. Before its 28 scheduled termination, the trust fund shall be reviewed as provided in section 215.3206(1) and (2), Florida Statutes. 29 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004, if
