HB 0563 2004 A bill to be entitled

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An act relating to education; creating the Harnessing the Power of Education Technology Advisory Council; providing for membership, powers, and duties; requiring a report; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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- Section 1. (1) The Harnessing the Power of Education Technology Advisory Council is created, for administrative purposes, within the Department of Education.
- (2) The purpose of the council is to recommend policies and actions regarding the use of technology in public education, how technology can be leveraged to positively impact student academic achievement, and how school-based deployments can effectively bridge the digital divide.
- The council shall be composed of 15 members as follows:
- (a) The Commissioner of Education, who shall serve as chair.
 - Two representatives appointed by the Governor.
- Three members of the Senate, including the chair of the Education Committee, a member of the minority party recommended by the minority leader, and a member chosen by the President of the Senate.
- Three members of the House of Representatives, including the chair of the Education Committee, a member of the minority party recommended by the minority leader, and a member chosen by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

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(e) The President of the Florida Association of District School Superintendents.

- (f) The President of the Florida Education Association.
- (g) Two representatives who are education/technology coordinators for local school districts. One representative must be from an urban district and one must be from a rural district.
 - (h) The President of the Florida Chamber of Commerce.
- (i) The President of the Florida School Boards Association.

Each member may appoint a designee to serve on his or her behalf. However, any designee must be in a position that reports directly to the member.

- (4) Members of the council shall be appointed to terms beginning July 1, 2004, and ending December 31, 2005. A member may be removed by the appointing officer for cause or for being absent from three consecutive meetings. Any member appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor.
- (5) The council shall meet at least quarterly, but may meet upon the call of the chair. All actions taken by the council shall be based upon approval by a simple majority of those members present.
- (6) Members of the council shall be reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses as provided in section 112.061, Florida Statutes. Members who are state officers or employees may be reimbursed for such expenses by their respective agencies.
 - (7) The council shall:

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(a) Examine large-scale, innovative education technology initiatives, specifically regarding wireless mobile computing devices, and shall analyze the impact that such initiatives have on teaching, learning, and student achievement, including standardized testing.

- (b) Study the impact that the initiatives have had on bridging the digital divide.
- (c) Develop effective methods of measuring student achievement and learning using technology.

- (d) Recommend a statewide public-private initiative to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives regarding the effective use of technology to improve student academic achievement.
- (e) Create ad hoc issue-oriented workgroups to make recommendations to the council and the Governor. Such workgroups may include representatives of the private sector and of the public sector.
- (f) Identify and recommend to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives sources for funding the initiative.
- Section 2. The council shall submit a report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by October 15, 2005.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
