A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to trust funds; creating the Child Advocacy Trust Fund within the Department 3 4 of Children and Family Services; providing for 5 sources of funds and purposes; requiring the 6 development of an allocation methodology for 7 distributing funds deposited in the trust fund; providing for funds to establish children's 8 9 advocacy centers; providing for future 10 legislative review and termination or 11 re-creation of the trust fund; providing a 12 contingent effective date. 13 14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 15 16 Section 1. Child Advocacy Trust Fund. --17 (1)(a) The Child Advocacy Trust Fund is created within the Department of Children and Family Services for the purpose 18 19 of receiving funds collected from the additional court cost 20 imposed in cases of certain crimes against minors under section 938.10, Florida Statutes. Funds shall be appropriated 21 22 to the Department of Children and Family Services for the specific purpose of funding children's advocacy centers. Funds 23 shall be disbursed to the Florida Network of Children's 24 25 Advocacy Centers, Inc., as established under section 39.3035, 26 Florida Statutes, for the purpose of providing community-based 27 services that augment, but that do not duplicate, services 28 provided by state agencies. 29 (b) The Board of Directors of the Florida Network of 30 Children's Advocacy Centers, Inc., shall retain 10 percent of

all revenues collected for network expenditures to provide

1 funds to match local contributions in communities establishing children's advocacy centers. The board of directors must 2 3 develop funding criteria and an allocation methodology that 4 ensures an equitable distribution of remaining funds among 5 network participants. The criteria and methodologies must take 6 into account factors that include, but need not be limited to, 7 the center's accreditation status with respect to the National Children's Alliance, the number of clients served, and the 8 9 population of the area being served by the children's advocacy 10 center. (2) Pursuant to Section 19(f)(2), Article III of the 11 12 State Constitution, the trust fund shall, unless terminated sooner, be terminated on July 1, 2008. Before its scheduled 13 termination, the trust fund shall be reviewed as provided in 14 15 section 215.3206(1) and (2), Florida Statutes. 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004, if Senate Bill \_\_\_\_ or similar legislation is adopted in the same 17 18 legislative session, or an extension thereof, and becomes law. 19 20 21 SENATE SUMMARY Creates the Child Advocacy Trust Fund within the Department of Children and Family Services. Provides for the source of funds. Specifies that funds generated are to be dispersed to the Florida Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, Inc. Requires that funds generated be used to provide community-based services that augment but do not duplicate any services provided by a state agency. Requires the Board of Directors to develop funding criteria and allocation methodologies to disperse funds. 22 23 24 25 26 Requires the Florida Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, Inc., to retain 10 percent of revenues collected to match local contributions in communities establishing 27 2.8 children's advocacy centers. 29 30
