     The committee substitute clarifies that the flag must be made of cloth rather than a display of a picture of a flag or some other rendition. Student activity and service fees are to be used for the purchase of the flags and the necessary display hardware. The actual installation of the flags would be the responsibility of the educational institution. A time period is added to the bill to mandate that the provisions of the bill be satisfied prior to July 1, 2005.
