I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates and modifies the Legislative Lobbyist Registration Trust Fund, effective November 4, 2004. The Legislative Lobbyist Registration Trust Fund, FLAIR #11-2-442, is administered by the legislative branch. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-81, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 11.045, F.S., creates and provides a revenue source for the Legislative Lobbyist Trust Fund. The fund is used for the purpose of funding any office established for the administration of the registration of lobbyists lobbying the Legislature, including the payment of salaries and other expenses, and for the purpose of paying the expenses incurred by the Legislature in providing services to lobbyists. The major sources of revenue for the trust fund are fees and fines. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-03 were \$172,904.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
