### I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Invasive Plant Control Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Invasive Plant Control Trust Fund, FLAIR #37-2-030, is administered by the Department of Environmental Protection. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-312, Laws of Florida.

### II. Present Situation:

Pursuant to s. 369.252, F.S., the purpose of the fund is to provide resources to eradicate or maintain control of invasive exotic plants on public lands. Sections 201.15, 206.606 and 328.76, F.S., provide revenue sources. These sources include 2.28% of documentary stamp tax revenues, \$6.3 million in gas tax revenues, and a portion of commercial and non-commercial vessel registration fees. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-2003 were \$51.1 million.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
