I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Nonmandatory Land Reclamation Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Nonmandatory Land Reclamation Trust Fund, FLAIR #37-2-506, is administered by the Department of Environmental Protection. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-99, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 378.033, F.S., creates the trust fund, and sections 211.31 and 211.3103, F.S., provide revenue sources. Sections 376.86, 378.034, 378.035, 378.036, and 403.4154, F.S., provide for the use of the fund. The purpose of the Nonmandatory Land Reclamation Trust Fund is to reclaim lands disturbed by phosphate mining that were not subject to mandatory reclamation and for the abatement of an imminent hazard related to phosphate mining. The major source of revenue for the trust fund is an excise tax on the severance of phosphate. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-2003 were \$7.8 million.
