I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Administrative Trust Fund without modification. The Administrative Trust Fund, FLAIR #42-2-021, is administered by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-63, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

The Administrative Trust Fund was established to provide funding for activities of the Office of the Commissioner and Division of Administration. The trust fund is supported by assessing other trust funds for the cost of the Division of Administration. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-2003 were \$6.4 million.
