### I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Agricultural Law Enforcement Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Agricultural Law Enforcement Trust Fund, FLAIR #42-2-025, is administered by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. This fund was last recreated effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-62, Laws of Florida.

#### II. Present Situation:

The purpose of the Agricultural Law Enforcement Trust Fund is to control and account for proceeds received from forfeited properties under the provisions of the Florida Contraband Act. Section 932.7055(5)i, F.S., provides a revenue source for the fund. The major sources of revenue for the fund are receipts from restitution payments, forfeiture of real property and personal property received by the Department. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-2003 were \$.4 million.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
