HB 0777 2004 A bill to be entitled

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An act relating to working waterfronts; defining the term "working waterfront"; providing requirements of counties and governmental entities with respect to working waterfronts; authorizing assessment of a fee to fund public boat ramp construction; requiring a study and report to the Governor and Legislature; providing an effective date.

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WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes there is a significant interest in the availability and economic impact of public marinas and public boat ramps along the navigable waterways in this state, and

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WHEREAS, it is the interest of the Legislature that local governmental comprehensive plans encourage the availability of working waterfronts by means of restrictions or incentives, NOW, THEREFORE,

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Definition. -- As used in this act, the term "working waterfront" means a facility that requires direct access to or location in marine waters and therefore cannot be located inland, including, but not limited to, public marinas, public boat ramps, boat hauling and repair facilities, waterfront recreational facilities, commercial fishing facilities, and boating facilities.

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Section 2. Requirements. --

(1) For the purpose of funding public boat ramp construction, a county government may assess up to an additional \$10 for any vessel less than 40 feet long that can be transported by a trailer within the jurisdiction of the county.

- (2) Each county government through its comprehensive plan is authorized to provide a sufficient number of boat ramps to achieve a boat trailer parking capacity of 5 percent of the registered available vessels within its jurisdiction by July 1, 2014.
- (3) A governmental entity that removes a working waterfront facility for any development and thereby limits public access to the working waterfront must replace the facility within its jurisdiction. The replacement facility must be substantially the same, provide similar access to navigable waterways, and be available for use when the existing working waterfront facility is removed.
- Section 3. Working waterfront study. -- The Department of Community Affairs shall commission a study on the economic trends of the working waterfronts of the state and the impact the loss of critical working waterfronts would have on the state's economy. The study shall include, but not be limited to, findings concerning coastal and waterway development trends and their impact on the working waterfronts. The study shall be completed no later than November 1, 2004, and a written report on the conclusions of this study shall be submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
 - Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
