I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Florida Agricultural Promotion Campaign Trust Fund without modification. The Florida Agricultural Promotion Campaign Trust Fund, FLAIR #42-2-920, is administered by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. This fund was last recreated effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-66, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 571.26, F.S., creates the Florida Agricultural Promotion Campaign Trust Fund to promote and advertise Florida agricultural products to the consumer with the intent of increasing sales and creating greater consumer awareness of agricultural products, grown and produced in the state. The major sources of revenue for the fund are the registration and renewal fees collected by the department from persons participating in the Florida Agricultural Promotional Campaign. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-2003 were \$53,730.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
