I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Conservation and Recreation Lands Program Trust Fund without modification. The Conservation and Recreation Lands Program Trust Fund, FLAIR #42-2-931, is administered by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. This fund was created effective July 1, 2000, by Chapter 2000-287, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 570.207, F.S., creates the Conservation and Recreation Lands Program Trust Fund. The purpose of the trust fund is to provide for the management of conservation and recreation lands by the department. Sections 570.207 and 570.71, F.S., provide revenue sources for the trust fund. Funds are provided through a transfer from the Department of Environmental Protection or from other sources as the Legislature may determine. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-2003 were \$14.8 million.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
