House Joint Resolution

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 4 of Article VI of the State Constitution, relating to suffrage and elections, to authorize the Legislature to provide the conditions under which a convicted felon's right to register or vote may be restored.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the amendment to Section 4 of Article VI of the State Constitution set forth below is agreed to and shall be submitted to the electors of Florida for approval or rejection at the general election to be held in November 2004:

ARTICLE VI

SUFFRAGE AND ELECTIONS

SECTION 4. Disqualifications.--

(a) No person convicted of a felony, or adjudicated in this or any other state to be mentally incompetent, shall be qualified to ~~vote or~~ hold office until restoration of civil rights or removal of disability. No person convicted of a felony shall be qualified to vote until the person's right to register or vote has been restored, as provided by law. No person adjudicated in this state to be mentally incompetent shall be qualified to vote until removal of disability.

(b) No person may appear on the ballot for re-election to any of the following offices:

- (1) Florida representative,
- (2) Florida senator,
- (3) Florida Lieutenant governor,
- (4) any office of the Florida cabinet,

32 (6) U.S. Senator from Florida

34 if, by the end of the current term of office, the person will  
 35 have served (or, but for resignation, would have served) in that  
 36 office for eight consecutive years.
