19	(1) INTENTIt is the intent of the Legislature that each
20	student's progression from one grade to another be determined,
21	in part, upon proficiency in reading, writing, science, <u>social</u>
22	studies, and mathematics; that district school board policies
23	facilitate such proficiency; and that each student and his or
24	her parent be informed of that student's academic progress.
25	(2) COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAMEach district school board
26	shall establish a comprehensive program for student progression
27	which must include:
28	(b) Specific levels of performance in reading, writing,
29	science, social studies, and mathematics for each grade level,
30	including the levels of performance on statewide assessments as
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defined by the commissioner, below which a student must receive remediation, or be retained within an intensive program that is different from the previous year's program and that takes into account the student's learning style.

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(4) ASSESSMENT AND REMEDIATION. --

Each student must participate in the statewide 36 (a) assessment tests required by s. 1008.22. Each student who does 37 not meet specific levels of performance as determined by the 38 district school board in reading, writing, science, social 39 studies, and mathematics for each grade level, or who does not 40 41 meet specific levels of performance as determined by the commissioner on statewide assessments at selected grade levels, 42 must be provided with additional diagnostic assessments to 43 determine the nature of the student's difficulty and areas of 44 academic need. 45

(7) ANNUAL REPORT.--

In addition to the requirements in paragraph (5)(b), 47 (a) each district school board must annually report to the parent of 48 each student the progress of the student toward achieving state 49 and district expectations for proficiency in reading, writing, 50 science, social studies, and mathematics. The district school 51 board must report to the parent the student's results on each 52 statewide assessment test. The evaluation of each student's 53 progress must be based upon the student's classroom work, 54 observations, tests, district and state assessments, and other 55 56 relevant information. Progress reporting must be provided to the parent in writing in a format adopted by the district school 57 board. 58
