SUMMARY ANALYSIS

Section 334.071, F.S., specifies the purpose and effect of the designation of roads, bridges, and other transportation facilities for honorary or memorial purposes by the Florida Legislature.

HB 9 designates a portion of U.S. Highway 192 from Interstate 95 in Brevard County to St. Cloud in Osceola County as Howard E. Futch Memorial Highway.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is directed to erect suitable markers to denote the honorary designation. The markers will cost approximately \$800.00.

HB 9 does not create any constitutional issues. It takes effect upon becoming law.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

Section 334.071, F.S., provides for legislative designations of transportation facilities for honorary or memorial purposes, or to distinguish a particular facility. The legislative designations do not "officially" change the current names of the facilities, nor does it require local governments and private entities to change street signs, mailing addresses, or 911 emergency telephone-number system listings. The statute requires FDOT to place a marker at each terminus or intersection of an identified road or bridge. and to erect other markers it deems appropriate for the transportation facility. The statute also provides that a city or county must pass a resolution in support of a particular designation before road markers are erected. Additionally, if the designated road segment extends through multiple cities or counties then a resolution must be passed by each affected local government.

Based on FDOT records, 999 honorary road and bridge designations have been approved since 1922, most of them by the Legislature. Some public roads and bridges have multiple or overlapping designations.

HB 9 designates U.S. Highway 192 from Interstate 95 in Brevard County to St. Cloud in Osceola County as Howard E. Futch Memorial Highway.

Senator Howard E. Futch died Thursday, January 23, 2003. He was elected to the Florida House of Representatives in 1992 and served through 2000. He was elected to the Florida Senate on August 21, 2001 and subsequently reelected in 2002.

This bill directs FDOT to erect suitable markers for this designation.

HB 9 takes effect upon becoming law

C. SECTION DIRECTORY:

Section 1: Creates honorary road designation for Senator Howard E. Futch in Brevard and Osceola Counties. Directs the FDOT to erect suitable markers designating the highway.
