WHEREAS, all Rotarians worldwide are united in a campaign to eradicate polio by 2005 and have provided volunteers to assist in immunizing children in polio-endemic countries, and

WHEREAS, Rotary Clubs develop service projects that deal with children at risk, poverty and hunger, the environment, illiteracy, and violence and support youth programs, educational opportunities, and international exchanges for students, teachers, and professionals, and

WHEREAS, the Dunedin Rotary Club, the Dunedin North Rotary Club, and other community partners are building the Rotary Centennial Visitor Center, an interactive nature center at Honeymoon Island, a state park located in Pinellas County, and
